The King of Life ... The liturgy for today's Feast of Christ the King tells us that his is “a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love, and peace.” Indeed, all these realities fit together perfectly. Truth and life go together, because when we know the truth about God's love and care for creation, we will respect all life. When we know the truth about ourselves, that we belong only to God, then we realize we cannot destroy any other person. A respect for life, personally as well as in our laws and policies as a nation, is the first requirement of justice and an absolute condition of peace. And the holier we are, the more we allow God's grace into our every thought and desire, the more we will adhere to truth, defend life, and promote justice and peace.

PRAYERS FOR THE DEAD ... “It is a holy & pious thought to pray for the dead.” (2 Macc 12:45). One of the corporal works of mercy is to pray for the dead. Those persons whom we have loved during their life here on earth, we should still remember to pray for after they have died. **The best prayer of all is the Mass.** Envelopes are available at the Bulletin Board in the Narthex to request Masses to be offered for the repose of the soul of any of your loved ones. The usual Mass stipend is \$10.00. Simply write the name of the deceased person on the envelope and your name and enclose \$10.00. If you write a check, please make it payable to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church and write “Mass Stipend” in the memo. The Mass intentions are listed in the Bulletin. Pray for the dead!

From the Book “The Holy Souls” ... “Those who have passed to the other world know that life is short and that we must try to do as much good as we can while on earth so that we will gain merit for it in the other world. So why then don't we ask their help in times of temptation? Why don't we ask their help in times of trial and anguish? Rest assured that they are ready and waiting to help us and will become our dearest friends if only they are given the chance.

If the Holy Souls in general care so much about us, how much more concerned, then, must our own dear departed ones be? The members of our own families? Be sure that they are closer to us than ever before and that their assistance is constant. They have not left us at all. Indeed, they are much closer to us. Call on them and ask their help, and you will see the results.

The author of **The Imitation of Christ** asks us to remember always the dear departed through prayers and good works, and that we should also do many good works for the benefit of our own souls while we have the chance in this life. We should pay no attention to those who scoff or laugh at us, saying that Purgatory does not exist. Perhaps they even dare to say that it is all in our imagination. If it is in our imagination, then it is also in the imaginations of all those saints who have gone before us and who have left their testimony behind them. It is a serious obligation on our part to pray for our deceased relatives, particularly one's mother and father.” [p.90-91]

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... Today we have a modern feast, less than a century old, and placed at the very end of the liturgical cycle of Sundays only in 1969. In 1925, the world was in a sorry state from the vantage point of Pope Pius XI. The winds of war had swept the map of Europe raw, and ancient Christian dynasties had fallen in Russia and Spain. Although the Great War had ended, wars were breaking out everywhere. Fascism was already in control in Italy, and Nazism was on the horizon for Germany. The disorder making its claim on the human race was, the pope felt, an insult to the Divine Order. Pius XI designated the last Sunday in October as a day of universal recognition of the kingship of Christ. Creating this feast was an act of bravery by the pope, who was standing up against idolatry of the state and the dehumanizing forces of the modern world, things that are not hard to detect in today's world as well. In 1969 it seemed fitting to move the feast to a place of honor at the end of the year, a way of summing up the whole movement of the liturgical year toward the perfection of the Kingdom of God. In recent decades, many Protestant churches have adopted this day from the new Roman calendar, so it is shared now with the Church of England, the Episcopal, Presbyterian, and Lutheran churches, and others.

At the end of time as we know it, Christ's work of restoring all things to unity and harmony with their Creator God will be completed. This Sunday, when we claim Christ as both our Shepherd and our King, we recognize our own calling to participate in Christ's saving work by caring for those whom Jesus calls "the least ones" (Matthew 25:45) Copyright © J.
