Steve Ray was raised in a Baptist family. His wife, Janet, was raised in the Presbyterian faith. They were married in 1976 and attended various churches. Eventually they stopped attending church "because of the shallowness of what we found." Janet said "we found out the early Church was Catholic, it wasn't Protestant. We were taught it was Protestant." Steve said: "Jesus did not leave us with an authoritative Book, He left us with an authoritative Church and later, through time, that Church gave us an authoritative Book, but the Church came first."
