<u>Observation</u> (on the rollos from the new Cursillo Manual) by Fr. Jeremy Hazuka, Spiritual Director for Women's Cursillo Weekend, St. John the Baptist Parish in Minden, Feb. 24-27:

What I seemed to have observed with the revisions of the rollos is that they more clearly present a direction for the candidate to take after they leave the 3 Day Weekend. The rollos, especially the personal witnesses, not only inspire, but it appears that the new cursillistas will be better able to follow the Cursillo Method because it was laid out in a logical, step-by-step manner through the outlines given for the rollos by the weekend manual. Basically the candidates are inspired and then are given the tools and encouragement needed to go inspire others.

1. Ultreva Center News:

Details regarding upcoming Ultreyas will be included in each Newsletter and are also available on the diocesan web page: http://webpages.charter.net/seas/cursillolincoln.html.

- ♦ The Beatrice/Crete/Hebron/Lincoln Ultreya Center continues its rotation of locations ... The <u>February</u> Ultreya would normally be held on <u>February 27, 2011</u>; however, ALL cursillistas (not just those from this Ultreya Center) are encouraged, instead, to come to the *Women's Closing* in Minden to welcome the new Fourth Dayers. The <u>March</u> Ultreya is scheduled for <u>March 27</u> at the St. Joseph Parish Center in Beatrice. There will NOT be an <u>April</u> Ultreya, as April 24 is Easter Sunday.
- ◆ The **Southwest Ultreya Center** will continue to rotate its Ultreya location between McCook and Imperial. The <u>March</u> Ultreya will be held on <u>March 13</u> at 3:30 pm CT in the basement of St. Patrick Church in McCook and the <u>April</u> Ultreya will be held on <u>April 10</u> at 2:30 pm MT in the basement of St. Patrick Church in Imperial.
- ♦ The Plattsmouth/Nebraska City Ultreya Center Check the parish bulletin for Church of the Holy Spirit in Plattsmouth (www.holyspiritplattsmouth.com), or contact Terry Little for more information.
- ◆ The **Vietnamese-language Ultreya** continues to be held the fourth Sunday of each month at 3:00pm at **Immaculate Heart of Mary Rectory Basement** in **Lincoln** (6405 Madison Ave).

2. Precursillo

There's still time to invite your friend to live the Women's Cursillo Weekend ... by NO LATER THAN Tuesday, February 22, 2011, you should have candidate information (name, address, phone number, email address, sponsor information) to Kathy Springer, Coordinator for the Weekend (email is fine ... ks90710@windstream.net). However, the registration form still needs to be submitted by Thursday (the form reports important information for health and emergency situations, and has been essential on past Weekends). Remember that the Sponsor needs to write a Palanca letter that will be given to the candidate on Friday evening of the Weekend, so that will need to be in Minden when the Weekend begins Thursday evening.

Who is God counting on you to invite? Registration forms are available from the Cursillo of Lincoln website (http://webpages.charter.net/seas/cursillolincoln.html). Please use the most recent forms, as information has changed. The Registration Form should be filled out by the candidate and returned to you as the sponsor; you should fill out the Sponsor Form (and be prepared to fulfill the sponsor responsibilities described on the back of the form), including getting the candidate's pastor's signature, and send the Registration Form and Sponsor Form together with the registration fee (\$20) to Kathy (because the Weekend is only a few days away – 1410 E. 15th St., Crete, NE 68333; normally registration materials would go to the Lay Director).

4. Postcursillo

♦ Region VI

The Region VI Spring Encounter is scheduled for April 8-10, 2011, in Wichita, KS (see the Region VI webpage: http://www.cursillo.org/region6/index.htm for details and Registration Form). Regional Encounters are normally held the last full weekend in September and April (to allow for consistency in planning); however, in 2011, Easter Sunday is the last weekend in April. The topic for the Region VI Spring Encounter will be "The Cursillo Weekend". Again, there is much to consider on this topic – *if you have questions about why the Weekends are the way they are, come and find out.* Cursillistas are invited to participate in this Encounter to learn more about the various roles involved in the Three Day Cursillo phase of the Movement. It's a wonderful opportunity for cursillistas throughout the Region to ask questions about the Three Days and learn and share with cursillistas from the other dioceses that will be participating.

♦ Cursillo de Cursillos

The **Rapid City, SD Diocese** is inviting all Region VI Dioceses/Archdioceses to an English-language **Cursillo de Cursillos** the weekend of **March 24-27, 2011**. A registration form is available on our Lincoln Diocese Cursillo webpage as well as the Region VI Cursillo webpage: http://www.cursillo.org/region6/index.htm. We have wanted to hold a Cursillo de Cursillos ever since they began in October 2009. There is a very good article from the National Newsletter entitled, "Cursillo de Cursillos – What is it?" (the article can be accessed in its entirety by going to the National webpage http://www.natl-cursillo.org/ and clicking on the School of Leaders link – it is one of the articles listed there). During the Practice Weekend, one of the team members commented that there should be a Cursillo for cursillistas ... that's what a Cursillo de Cursillos is!! Don't miss this wonderful opportunity!

♦ 21st National Encounter

Make plans to attend the 21st National Cursillo Encounter, which is Thursday, July 28 – Sunday, July 31, 2011, at St Mary's University, San Antonio, Texas. The Encounter registration fee is \$370 if you register by May 31, 2011. The registration form is available on the National Cursillo webpage www.natlcursillo.org (you may also register on-line). The capacity is 600 persons, and rooms are assigned on a first come, first serve basis. The registration fee includes three nights lodging, dinner on Thursday evening, 3 meals on Friday and Saturday, and breakfast on Sunday morning. Shuttle service from San Antonio International Airport (SAT) will be provided on Thursday, July 28, 2011. Departure shuttles will be available on Sunday, July 31, 2011. 5. School of Leaders (SOL)

At the January SOL, held on January 8, 2011, at St. Ann Parish in Doniphan, the technique talks focused on insights from Eduardo Bonnin, the founder of the Cursillo Movement as we know it today, about the origins and purpose of the Cursillo Movement. In the last newsletter, it was note that Eduardo believed his greatest asset was the knowledge he was given of the Cursillo Movement. In his book, he says: "... the knowledge of the 'Cursillos in Christianity Movement' is the most important property that I own. At the time of making my will I think that the best thing I can pass on to those who come after me is to leave in writing and in detail what this Movement consists of, and what its purpose is, and what are the aims to be achieved by the Movement" (hence, his "spiritual testament").

Since Eduardo is gone, we need to be responsible custodians and it behooves us to learn about and better know this Movement in order for us to use it to its best potential. Come to SOL and learn more ... we will continue the study of Eduardo's spiritual testament at the April SOL on April 16, 2011 at St. James Parish, Cortland. The next School of Leaders was moved from the second Saturday (April 9), which is when it is normally held, to April 16 because the Spring Region VI Encounter is scheduled for April 8-10 (it had to be moved up because Easter is the last Sunday in April, when the Encounter is normally held).

Those planning to participate should remember to bring a sack lunch. Also note that for all future SOLs, the Mass that precedes SOL will begin at 9:00am and SOL will start at 9:30am.

From the Spiritual Advisor

In a couple of weeks, we will begin the holy season of Lent. Each year the Church invites us to enter into this 40-day journey with our Lord. We are encouraged to choose to discipline ourselves ... our minds and our wills, as well as our bodies ... to focus more on the Lord and less on ourselves. We are to take up our cross and follow the Lord. We are to die to ourselves, to selfishness, and to sin, in order that we might make more room in our lives for the Lord and for all the graces that He wants to give to us.

This process of dying to ourselves and being more open to the Lord's graces will deepen our life of Piety. Really, it is the Lord who deepens our life of Piety, but we need to let Him do that in us. Letting the Lord into our lives, is another way of saying that we enter into a deeper encounter with Him. This requires our growth in humility ... our growth in knowledge of ourselves, both our strengths and our weaknesses, and recognizing our need for the Lord in our lives. It is a process of recognizing that we need to encounter the Lord in a deeper way.

Each of us encountered the Lord through our Baptism, and we encountered Him again through our Three Day Weekend. We need to remember that while our Baptism had a profound effect on us, it was not a one-moment event; instead, we are called to continue to live out our Baptismal promises each and every day ... we are called to live as baptized persons throughout the rest of our lives. Similarly, our Three Day Weekend had a significant effect on our lives, but there, too, we need to continue to live out in our daily lives what we learned and experienced during our Three Day Weekend.

In our Fourth Day, through our Piety, our Study, and our Action, we can continue to deepen our encounter with Him. But we must remember that our Piety, Study, and Action are not "ends in themselves" ... they should go beyond simply producing a "warm feeling" ... through our efforts to grow in Piety, Study, and Action, we should be letting the Lord draw us to a deeper encounter with Him, and letting Him use us to Christianize our environments and bring others closer to Him. So too, during Lent, we are encouraged to pray, to fast, and to give alms. We are encouraged to do penance. But prayer, fasting, almsgiving, and penance are not an end in themselves, but rather opportunities for us to focus more on the Lord and less on ourselves.

In encouraging you to continue to grow, I want to remind you that there are a number of opportunities in the next two months for you to let the Lord help you to grow more in your knowledge of the Cursillo Movement and to let Him use you to bring His Gospel to the world. Earlier in this newsletter you read about the Cursillo de Cursillos that is being hosted by the Rapid City, SD Diocese on March 24-27. This is a great opportunity to let the Lord expand your understanding of the Cursillo Movement and to deepen your Piety, Study, and Action. On April 8-10, the Diocese of Wichita, KS is hosting the Region VI Spring Encounter. The topic is the Three Days, and you will learn more about the depths of the Cursillo Movement by learning how the Three Day Weekend was designed to give us all the tools we need to live our Fourth Day well ... apostolically. Then, on April 16, our Diocese is hosting our bi-monthly School of Leaders (SOL) at St. James Parish in Cortland ... ALL are invited to join together in friendship as we do the work of Cursillo together.

So, as you journey through the season of Lent, and as you live your Fourth Day, I encourage you to keep the focus on the Lord. Remember His love for you and that He wants you to show your love for Him by putting Him first in your life and by letting Him use you to do His work ... and that may very well entail doing His work through Cursillo.
