From the Spiritual Advisor

For the last week and a half (since March 16/17), most of our schedules have been adjusted in many different ways due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic. Now, many of us are connecting with or interacting with other persons through technology rather than in person in order to preserve or establish the proper social distancing. It is important that we are faithful and obedient to these suggestions and requirements and that we make very prudent choices in regards to our physical health.

It is also important that we make very prudent choices in regards to our spiritual health. As part of our making good choices for our spiritual health, we are journeying with the entire Church through the holy season of Lent. During the past Sundays of Lent, we have heard about our Lord being tempted, His transfiguration, His discussion with the Samaritan woman at the well, His restoring sight to the man born blind, and His raising Lazarus from the dead. In each of these Gospel passages, Jesus (who shares our human nature in all things but sin) shows us through the events of His life how we are to live our lives.

We are to remember God's Words found in the Scriptures during times of temptation ... remembering God's faithfulness to His people of all times. We are to look for ways to see Jesus' divinity shine through His humanity, through our humanity, and through the humanity of other persons in our lives. When we strive to open our hearts and minds to allow God's graces to direct our words and actions, it transform us to into the persons He wants us to become. By allowing God's graces to transform us, we allow His grace to strengthen us and give us hope during the difficult and challenging times of suffering and the cross.

We are invited to look for opportunities to interact with other persons (even from a "social distance" and through technology) that the rest of the world might consider as social outcasts or persons not worth our investment of time. In our conversations with these persons, we invite them to talk on a level deeper than the usual physical or social topics, and share our faith in God and share our hope. Our deeper and more personal conversations, with God's grace, can encourage them to see themselves differently and might even lead them to be willing to speak to others in a deeper, more faith filled way.

We are invited to really notice people that we meet, and observe what they are saying and doing and what they are not saying and not doing. With eyes of faith, we are invited to interact with them on a personal level and a faith level and with God's grace to lead them to see the events of their life in a way that encourages them to see God's presence in their life and to hope for something better and more than just what is offered by the world. Doing this is also an opportunity for us to allow God to sharpen and clarify our own spiritual sight and how we see others and the events around us.

Finally, we are invited to allow the Lord to help us take a good deep look at ourselves and at areas of our life that might be spiritually dead or burdens that we have been carrying that have killed our spiritual lives. The Lord wants us, during this season of Lent and even during this pandemic, to allow Him to redirect and correct our habits, our weak spiritual sight, our conversation, and to reflect on our choices of where we go and what we do and how we spend our time.

May each of us choose to spend more time in prayer, allowing the Lord to deepen our response to His offer of friendship with us. Then after choosing to spend our time with our Best Friend (Jesus), we will be strengthened and encouraged with His grace and to spend time deepening our friendship with others. First spend time with Jesus. Then look for Jesus in your friends and ways to bring your friends closer to Jesus.

Perhaps during these challenging and unprecedented times, it would be good to remember the words of Saint Paul to the Romans (written during a time of great trial): "What will separate us from the love of Christ? Will anguish, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or the sword? As it is written: 'For your sake we are being slain all the day; we are looked upon as sheep to be slaughtered.' In all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Rom 8:35-39).

I invite you to spend time with Jesus, spend time with your friends, and lead your friends closer to Jesus ... through your friendship, discussions, and also invite them to experience a Three Day Weekend. Remember that Christ is counting on you.
