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**<u>19th National Encounter</u>** ... *It's not too late* ... information about the 19th National Encounter is available on the National Cursillo website [http://www.natl-cursillo.org]. The Encounter is being held at the California State University San Bernardino (CSUSB) on July 30 - August 2, 2009. The keynote address will be on "The Conversion of St. Paul". The three workshop sessions being offered are Piety, Study and Action. The cost is now \$410 per person if received from June 1 to June 26, 2009.

**IV World Ultreya** ... The IV World Ultreya is planned for **Saturday, August 1, 2009**, from 12:00 Noon to 9:00 PM, at the Anaheim Convention Center and Arena in Anaheim, California. Cursillistas can purchase tickets online via the National Cursillo website or by downloading an order form and mailing it to the National Cursillo Center in Dallas, TX. The ticket price to the IV World Ultreya is \$25.00. The ticket price does not include meals, but you may purchase food from the Arena vendors.

#### From the Secretariat ...

#### 1. <u>Ultreya Center News</u>:

- The Beatrice/Crete/Hebron/Lincoln Ultreya Center continues its rotation of locations ... Recall that the <u>June</u> Ultreya will be the Grand Ultreya at Van Dorn Park in Lincoln on June 28 (see details later in Newsletter). The <u>July</u> Ultreya will be on Sunday, July 26, in Beatrice (St. Joseph Parish Center); the <u>August</u> Ultreya will be on Sunday, August 23, in Hebron at Sacred Heart Parish Hall. Regular Ultreyas begin at 5:00pm.
- ◆ The Southwest Ultreya Center is changing its Ultreya location. Beginning with its <u>June</u> Ultreya, the cursillistas decided to begin alternating the Ultreya between McCook and Imperial. The <u>July</u> Ultreya will be held on July 12 at 3:30 pm in the basement of St. Patrick Church in McCook. The <u>August</u> Ultreya will be held on August 9 at 2:30 pm (mountain time; this would be 3:30 pm central time) at St. Patrick Church in Imperial. The Ultreya will continue to be held on the second Sunday of each month at 3:30 pm when held at St. Patrick Church (basement) in McCook, and at 2:30 pm when held at St. Patrick Church in Imperial (actually, the time is the same; there is a 1-hour time zone difference).

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#### 2. School of Leaders (SOL):

The June 13, 2009, SOL was held at St. Ann Parish in Doniphan. This is the first SOL using the new format. The day began with Mass at 9:30 a.m. (for those who wanted to assist), with SOL formally beginning at 10 a.m. with the Group Reunion. The two technique talks were combined with the work sessions to edit/review the **Total Security** rollo from the new Cursillo Manual for use in the Lincoln Diocese. The group made a visit to the Blessed Sacrament for shared prayer, then ate lunch. In conjunction with lunch, Fr. Seiker gave a doctrinal presentation related to St. Paul and his missionary journeys (as assisted by St. Barnabas). The day ended slightly earlier than planned due to participants' schedules.

The next SOL is scheduled for **August 8, 2009**, at St. James Parish in Cortland. The day will begin with Mass at 9:30 a.m. (optional), followed by 10:00am Group Reunion, the technique talks and work sessions, and the doctrinal talk. <u>All</u> cursillistas are invited to deepen their understanding of Cursillo, especially those who are just beginning their Fourth Day.

#### From the Spiritual Advisor

In a few weeks, our nation will celebrate Independence Day on July 4<sup>th</sup>. It is a great occasion each year to celebrate our freedom and independence as a nation. We should really reflect on the many blessings we have received from our Lord, both individually and as a nation! God has been and continues to be very good to us.

However, as we celebrate our independence as a nation and the freedom that we have as a nation, we must always remember that in all ways we are still dependent on God. We depend on Him for our life, our health, and really for all that we have and all that we are! Without God, we would not exist. By ourselves, we can do nothing, but with Him we can do all things. As we heard in the Leaders Rollo on our Three Day Weekend, "Christ and I are an overwhelming majority."

In His love and goodness, God created us and gave us our freedom. The Catechism of the Catholic Church discusses the topic of man's freedom (CCC 1730-1742), and it might be good to read and reflect on these paragraphs as we celebrate our independence and freedom as a nation. Perhaps this could be a part of your study before or after July 4<sup>th</sup>. This study could then have an effect on your Piety and Action ... you might pray for other persons to make the free choice to seek always God's will in their lives ... you might choose to respond to God's grace and act in specific ways that will encourage other Christians to speak and act for a renewed respect for all human life, or for true religious freedom in our country and throughout the world.

Before closing, I'd like to specifically quote from a couple of the paragraphs of the Catechism mentioned above:

*CCC 1733* The more one does what is good, the freer one becomes. There is no true freedom except in the service of what is good and just. The choice to disobey and do evil is an abuse of freedom and leads to "the slavery of sin." *(cf. Rom 6:17)* 

*CCC 1739* **Freedom and sin.** Man's freedom is limited and fallible. In fact, man failed. He freely sinned. By refusing God's plan of love, he deceived himself and became a slave to sin. This first alienation engendered a multitude of others. From its outset, human history attests the wretchedness and oppression born of the human heart in consequence of the abuse of freedom.

*CCC 1742* **Freedom and grace.** The grace of Christ is not in the slightest way a rival of our freedom when this freedom accords with the sense of the true and the good that God has put in the human heart. On the contrary, as Christian experience attests especially in prayer, the more docile we are to the promptings of grace, the more we grow in inner freedom and confidence during trials, such as those we face in the pressures and constraints of the outer world. By the working of grace the Holy Spirit educates us in spiritual freedom in order to make us free collaborators in his work in the Church and in the world:

Almighty and merciful God, in your goodness take away from us all that is harmful, so that, made ready both in mind and body, we may freely accomplish your will. (Roman Missal, 32<sup>nd</sup> Sunday, Opening Prayer)

May the Lord help each of us in our daily lives to freely live faithful to the Lord; and may the tools we learned in Cursillo help us to invite others to be truly free as well.

#### **From the Lay Director** Make a Friend

Can you remember the last time you made a new friend? And if you can, how did it happen? The Cursillo Method, by design, teaches us to pray and study daily that we may discover what God wants of us and that we may learn to love that which is true. Then we are to take what we have learned and pass it onto others ... Make a friend, be a friend, and then BRING THAT FRIEND TO CHRIST.

To share the truth about Jesus with others will take a well-formed friendship. When friendships are formed, then trust is built up so that what we say might begin to take root. If, by our actions, we do our best to live the Gospel message, then our actions will assist us in making our words credible.

If we are going to bring someone to Christ, we need to be true friends. Friendships don't just happen overnight ... they take time and effort. Friends will take extra time to help where there is a need ... they give of themselves even if it isn't convenient, and they forgive and love as Christ forgave and loved them.

Without friends to share our thoughts and ideas, our lives soon become somewhat unfulfilled. Have you ever wondered why it is so easy to spread gossip or why it is so hard to keep a secret? It is because it is our human nature to share what we know with others ... so if we share goodness, then it will be goodness that others will likely pass on.

Many times it takes faith and a good deal of courage to make a new friend. It isn't always easy, but you need to remember that you and Christ are an overwhelming majority! In addition, you need to remember that you can do all things through HIM Who strengthens you (*Phil 4:13*)

I recently read the May 31 meditation by Fr. Vincent Nagle from the book, <u>Praying with Saint</u> <u>Paul</u>: "... I was listening to a priest speaking to several hundred university students who had come to spend a few days with him in the Alps. At one point a girl stood up to ask a question. She said, 'When I am with my friends (of this Catholic movement), I am good. When I am not, I am bad.''' ... The priest responded, "First, stay with your friends. Second, imagine a man who has a weakness, we won't speculate what it is. Each morning he rises with confidence in Jesus and his Mother, light-hearted in his hope not to fail that day. He does fail, repeating that mistake arising from his weakness. He goes home full of tears and repentance, praying to Jesus and his Mother for compassion, forgiveness, and healing. Again, he awakens the next morning full of gratitude, and the pattern repeats itself. This goes on for years, perhaps for the rest of his life. What do we call a man like that? There was silence. The Priest, speaking forcefully now, insisted, 'What do we call him?' Again silence. Finally he said, 'A saint. He is a man alive entirely through his recognition of and confidence in the presence of Jesus and the prayers of his Mother. These define his entire reason for living. They define who he is. This is the definition of a saint.'"

Being a saint can seem to us an unrealistic goal, especially since we know ourselves better then anyone else. But, in this example, what really counts is effort that we make, fully aware that success is achieved only in, with, and through Christ.

So when do we get to quit? When have we had enough? Am I too young? Am I too old? What if I don't do it in a way that is perfect?

I believe that if we go to the Master with our worries and fears, then HE will give us the grace necessary to achieve all things, and that if we set limits on ourselves, then evil will prevail. Our work is done when Christ calls us home. Yes, we get tired ... Yes, we get discouraged ... Yes, we want to quit. But there IS help ... JESUS!

If you know Jesus and you love HIM, pass it on by making a new friend.
