Reminders re: Ultreya and Group Reunion (especially invitations to non-cursillistas):

- <u>Any Ultreya</u> (including the GRAND ULTREYA) is open to any cursillista and even noncursillistas.
- If your area is not holding regular Ultreyas, consider visiting a neighboring Ultreya Center.
- Also consider inviting a non-cursillista to experience Ultreya or Group Reunion, as these are ways of helping show/explain what Cursillo is. However, BEFORE you invite someone to a Group Reunion (whether that person is another cursillista or a non-cursillista), first ask the permission of your group members, as it is very important to respect the confidentiality and privacy of what is shared by the members of your Group. Also, keep in mind that a non-cursillista will not have the full understanding of the Cursillo Method without living the Three Day Weekend; thus, you should make it clear that these are only "stepping stones" leading to the Three Day Weekend and into the Fourth Day.
- The structure of what is shared at Group Reunion and Ultreya is **NOT a secret.** However, the details of what is shared **IS** confidential and **NOT** meant to be shared outside the group.

2. Precursillo

The work of the Precursillo is ongoing, and NOT done solely in the few weeks leading up to the next set of Weekends. The Precursillo's stated <u>purposes</u> are: (1) to study environments; (2) to select candidates through friendship; (3) to sponsor; and (4) to prepare our friends (candidates). The stated **objectives** of the Precursillo are tied to the four purposes:

1. Study of environments

In essence, this involves a proper study of those places/situations in which we find ourselves, with an eye toward selecting candidates in those environments with the leadership qualities that will transform the environment into a Christian one. The environments we are called to study are not exclusively related to the Church or parish ... we must look at ALL environments with an eye toward how best to win them for Christ.

- 2. Selection of candidates through friendship
 - A. Identify key persons within our environments.
 - B. Selection of candidates through friendship.
 - C. Selection of persons based on the effectiveness of the candidate as the leaven of his/her environment and circumstances.
 - D. Insure that all candidates satisfy the basic requirements to participate in the Cursillo Weekend.
- 3. To sponsor

To support each candidate according to the responsibilities listed on the back of the Lincoln Diocese Sponsor Form (see diocesan webpage).

4. To prepare our friends (candidates)

To prepare our friends with a view toward Postcursillo.

To achieve the purposes and objectives of the Precursillo, we need to truly open our eyes and look at our environments (the situation in which we find ourselves and those persons in that situation) with Christ's eyes. We need to take advantage of each opportunity our Lord gives us to *make a friend, be a friend, and bring our friend to Christ*. Do you want to know more??

Come to the October SOL, where the topic of discussion will be "What is involved in sponsoring a candidate on a Cursillo Weekend?" The October SOL is tentatively scheduled for October 9, 2010, from 10:00am – 3:00pm (with Mass at 9:30am) at St. Ann Parish in Doniphan, NE. However, note that it may move to Saturday, October 16 (same time, same place) – watch diocesan webpage and/or next newsletter for the exact date.

If you know of persons who are hungry to know our Lord better, and who want to grow in their spiritual lives, begin to prepare them for a Three Day Weekend. Continue to offer Palanca, that God might give you eyes to see and ears to listen for those who want to know Him better ... We should study our environments (those around us) at all times in search of persons who can help Christianize the world ... *He's counting on you!!!*

As always, the registration form for Three Day Weekend is available from the Cursillo of Lincoln website (http://webpages.charter.net/seas/cursillolincoln.html). **Please use the most recent forms**, as information has changed. The Registration Form should be filled out by the

candidate and returned to you as the sponsor; you should fill out the Sponsor Form (and be prepared to fulfill the sponsor responsibilities described on the back of the form), including getting the candidate's pastor's signature, and send the Registration Form and Sponsor Form together with the registration fee (\$20) to the Lay Director (address on the form).

3. Three Day Weekend

♦ Region VI

The Fall 2010 Region VI Encounter will be held on September 24-26, 2010 at St. Agnes Parish in Omaha, NE. Regional Encounters begin at approximately 8:00 p.m. on Friday evening (registration prior to opening) and conclude with the Ultreya on Saturday evening (Sunday morning Mass and breakfast are provided on Sunday morning; sack lunches for those traveling are also provided). This is SO close for our Diocese ... make plans now to be there to share in the work of Cursillo with others in our region!!

The **Registration Forms** are *not yet available*, but as soon as they become available, they will be posted on both the Lincoln Diocese webpage and the Region VI webpage.

♦ National:

It's not too late to participate in the 20th National Cursillo Encounter!! Information about the Encounter is available on the National Cursillo website [http://www.natl-cursillo.org]. The Encounter is being hosted by Region VI (our Region) at Rockhurst University in Kansas City, Missouri ... they don't get too much closer than this!! The keynote speaker will be Fr. David M. Knight, who wrote the books Cursillo Spiritual Formation Program (published by the Cursillo for use in School of Leaders) and His Way (which the Lincoln Diocese studied in SOL). The cost is still \$370 per person (the fee increase for later registration is not being imposed) if received by July 7, 2010. The Encounter is scheduled to be held Thursday, July 29 – Sunday, August 1, 2010.

Participating in the National Encounter would be a wonderful way for cursillistas, especially the new Fourth Dayers, to become more familiar with what is going on in Cursillo. As a matter of fact, our Episcopal advisor, Bishop Elizondo, is personally encouraging cursillistas to make the effort and sacrifice to attend this Encounter in order to be as well informed as possible in order to promote an authentic Cursillos of Christianity. Christ is counting on us!!

5. School of Leaders (SOL)

The next SOL will be **August 14, 2010**, at Sacred Heart Parish in Hebron (*see the enclosed registration form on the inside of the mailing cover*). As usual, the day will begin with Mass at 9:30 a.m., followed by 10:00am Group Reunion, the technique talks and work sessions, and the doctrinal talk.

The technique talks for the next SOL will come from Eduardo Bonnin's "My Spiritual Testimony" (the books will be available for purchase at SOL for \$5.00). According to the back cover of the book, "By means of these pages a discovery is made of the Foundational Charism of the Cursillo in Christianity Movement. Every line leads to contemplation of the 'living water' that has flowed from this Charism. After 67 years the water is still clear and life giving because of its authenticity and truthfulness. It is a charism that encourages people to encounter Christ in the normality of their life without abandoning the place where God has placed them by discovering a Christ who is alive, natural, personal and close to us and to the people in our environments. In this testament the ideas that are the stronghold of the Essence, Purpose and Mentality of the Cursillos in Christianity emphasizing that its method is friendship. This is the posthumous spiritual testament of the author, who wanted to convey the facts and their motives from the beginning of the Cursillos in Christianity Movement with the intention that they would endure."

<u>All</u> cursillistas are invited to deepen their understanding of Cursillo ... you are invited to study the roots of Cursillo!! <u>EVERYBODY</u> is invited. The more participation we have, the greater the joy ... the more we can accomplish with and for our Lord ... We all come away with a better understanding of the Cursillo Movement and its specific charism in the life of the Church.

From the Spiritual Advisor

We are in the liturgical season of Ordinary Time and during this liturgical year our Gospel readings for the Sunday Masses are taken from the Gospel of Luke. The Gospel of Luke is one of the three Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke). Synoptic means "same view", since many of the passages from Luke are very similar to passages which are found in Matthew or in Mark. As we journey through these summer months, Luke presents us with some important passages on which to reflect. In our reflections on the Word of God, it is always helpful to anchor our reflections into the entire context of the Gospel.

It would be helpful here to stop here and read the introduction to the New American Bible, as it gives some comments which would be helpful to keep in mind before reading the actual Gospel passages proclaimed at the Sunday Masses during June, July and August. These Gospel passages are from Luke 9 – Luke 14. As we reflect on the Gospel of Luke and seek to let our Lord's Words take root in our hearts and be lived out in our lives, we would do well to reflect in our own lives about living "each day" as the Lord calls us. Sometimes we set our focus too far into the future. While it is important to plan and especially that we make an apostolic plan each week, we must not miss that our Lord wants us to plan for each day, and not just for some "big" day in the future.

As we plan, remember that Jesus is our model for our threefold life of Piety, Study, and Action. He calls us to gaze on His face in the Scriptures, in the Eucharist, and in the lives of the persons around us. He calls us to study the persons we meet, to see Him present in them, and to recognize our dependence on Him. Thus, it is important that each day we take time to reflect on God's Word,

that we make an effort to spend extra time in His Eucharistic presence (each day, if possible), and that we also be alert to His presence in the other persons we meet. We need to put Him first in our lives and then put others before ourselves.

By putting Him first, reflecting on His Word, and being aware of His presence in others around us, we will better be able to follow Him. It is important to notice that three of the Gospel passages this summer (the sinful woman who comes to Jesus at the house of Simon the Pharisee, the Prodigal Son, and the Good Samaritan), are only found in the Gospel of Luke. Through these accounts, our attention is directed to the importance of God's mercy and compassion. After having reflected on His mercy in these Gospel passages, and having experienced His mercy and compassion in our lives, we will be better able to respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit and to imitate and express mercy and compassion to those around us.

May we see "each day" of these days of Ordinary Time as a gift to us, and may we strive to deepen our commitment to the Lord and live better our lives of Piety, Study, and Action. Encourage one another through your faithfulness to Group Reunion and Ultreya. Invite someone to come with you to the Grand Ultreya. Live each of these days of Ordinary Time in an extraordinary way.

From the Lay Director

For those who have the "Magnificat" or another monthly publication that includes the daily readings and a reflection, I think most of us do what I do – dog-ear or in some way mark the pages that have a particular reading or quote or writing of a saint that strikes us in a particular way. For me, at least for the period of time I am using my "Magnificat", I go back to these marked pages and re-read whatever it was that caught my interest or spoke to me. For June, it is 1 Corinthians 10:13. We all recall hearing, "God is faithful and will not let you be tried beyond your strength." For whatever reason, however, I do not seem to remember ever reading what follows: "but with the trial He will also provide a way out, so that you may be able to bear it." How much He loves us! I often see the trial or difficulty, but miss the way out of it, or what He gives me to bear it. He sends a raft in the storm, why was I looking for a big yacht?

A second reflection for me this month is the focus of the readings on faithfulness, on perseverance. God is faithful, He asks that we persevere. He also asks that we give. As Saint Paul writes in the Second Letter to Timothy, "be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient; ...; perform the work of an evangelist; fulfill your ministry." Am I fulfilling my ministry? Are you?

I think of the work we do in Cursillo. It is a joyful work ... it would be even more joyful if only a few more would pitch in to share in this work. If you feel that the Cursillo should be shared, should be experienced by others because of what it did for you and what it does for others, I ask — would you be willing to step forward and give some extra time for awhile? There is a faithful core of good people who feel so strongly about what Cursillo has done for them that they have and will continue to give of themselves. This core of people need more of you to share in the work of Cursillo — please consider becoming more active. Start by being faithful to your friendship group or join/start one. Come to Ultreya. And please consider attending the School of Leaders — you will be drawn in by the community that is there (like a school of fish, the community works to support one another). It is not a big commitment - a few hours of a Saturday every two months. We need God in our lives and we need community to help us walk that road to God. If you are not as active as you could be and God is tugging, please consider becoming more active. We continue to pray.
