

Report on 31st National Cursillo Encounter (2nd Virtual), July 23-24, 2021

The 31st National Cursillo Encounter (2nd Virtual Encounter) was held virtually on Friday and Saturday, July 23-24, 2021. The focus of the Encounter was better understanding Cursillo – its charism, its method, the Cursillo leader, and stewardship of the Movement.

The Encounter began on Friday evening with Mass (virtual on Zoom) celebrated by Father Mark Seiker at Saint Mary Catholic Church, Aurora. The readings, psalm, and songs were in English, Spanish, Vietnamese, and Tagalog (Philippine). After Mass, Ultreya was held with witness, echo (in several languages), and spiritual wrap up (Father Einer Ochoa).

Saturday morning began with morning prayers with short talks on the Blessed Mother (the Miraculous Medal, Our Lady of La Vang, Queen of Peace, and Our Lady of Manaoag) followed by the Sabitina. The day continued with four rollos which were followed by small group breakout sessions of approximately 10 cursillistas each. Father Alex Waraksa (Diocese of Knoxville, TN) gave the spiritual keynote, "Charism in the Light of the Gospel". Manuel Fernandez (Mallorca, Spain) then gave the keynote address, "Christ, Person, and Friendship". Manuel talked about his spiritual journey and the importance of friendship in all aspects of life. He knew and met with Eduardo Bonnin.

After Manuel's rollo, the Encounter broke into three language group sessions – English, Spanish, and Vietnamese. The two rollos that followed were given in the language of the assigned group. The third rollo was "Commitment and Discipline of the Cursillo Leader" by Father Mark Seiker as the English presenter. The focus of this rollo was discipleship and how it relates to Cursillo and the Cursillo leader (we are all leaders!). The final rollo, "Faithful Stewards of the Cursillo Movement", was given by Vince Johnson (Region 10 coordinator from Arizona). He focused on Cursillo as a gift and that to be faithful stewards of this gift, we must protect it, be faithful to it, and share it, as well as study it and know the founder, Eduardo Bonnin.

After the final breakout/sharing session, all the language groups gathered together for Mass, which was prayed by Father Mark Seiker, from Our Lady of Guadalupe church in Omaha. The day ended with a fiesta where there were seven performances by the different language groups. The National Encounters also end with a T-shirt auction (the 31st Encounter T-shirt) which was to be signed by all the presenters. The final bid was \$450! The Encounter ended approximately 6:30pm CST. Five cursillistas from the Lincoln Diocese participated. It would be difficult to estimate the total number of participants, but with around 300 screens and knowing there were multiple cursillistas at many locations, we could guess 350 or so. Being able to see friends again (albeit virtually) from across the country was really great; however nothing beats in-person encounters, and we hope things will get back to normal soon. In any case, it is wonderful to come together to share our faith as a Cursillo community. De Colores!

From the Spiritual Advisor

Bishop Robert Barron in a reflection in the Magnificat for Sunday, August 1, 2021 wrote: "we might render Jesus' response [This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent.] as this: the work that God requires is a confidence in and surrender to his Son. It is the willingness to enter into the moral and spiritual space opened up by Jesus, to become thereby a member of his Mystical Body. Therefore, believing in him implies participating in his manner of existence – which happens, on a Catholic reading, precisely through prayer, active discipleship, and receiving the sacraments." These words of Bishop Barron are reflecting on a passage from the 6th Chapter of St. John's Gospel, the Bread of Life Discourse. We are hearing from the Bread of Life Discourse in the Sunday Gospels during the last week of July and three weeks in August.

As Catholics we are fed by Jesus' Words proclaimed in the Scriptures at Mass and the Church's teaching that Jesus is really and truly present in Holy Communion. This prepares us to receive Jesus in Holy Communion at Mass. We continue to learn more about Jesus' real presence as we live our faith as disciples (students) of Jesus.

As Cursillistas, following the example of our founder Eduardo Bonnin, who referred to himself as an apprentice Christian, we consider ourselves disciples (students) of Jesus, and also students of Eduardo Bonnin through whom the Holy Spirit gave us the Charism of Cursillo. In living the Charism, we follow the method of Group Reunion and Ultreya. I encourage you to participate regularly in a weekly Group Reunion and a monthly Ultreya, either in person or over the phone or via ZOOM. Also come to the SOL (August 21) and the Grand Ultreya (September 19). Live your life as an apprentice Christian and tell others about Jesus with your words!

What is a Grand Ultreya?

This is a diocesan-wide, family-oriented event where cursillists from throughout the Lincoln Diocese (and sometimes other dioceses) gather to renew friendships, since friendship is the very heart of Cursillo.

- † It will begin with a potluck lunch and Ultreya. Those who are interested can attend the 10:45am Mass at St. Joseph Church, Giltner (15 minutes from Aurora).
- † This will be a **12:30pm potluck lunch**, so each family should bring a dish to share. Ultreya will follow lunch.
- † The Secretariat will bring plates, napkins, glasses and plastic-ware; coffee/iced tea/water will be provided.

- † Take Exit 332 off of I-80 and go north on Highway 14 for approximately 3.5 miles (Casey's will be on your right). Turn left onto US 34 (Q St.) for 6 blocks then left again (after Pizza Hut) onto 9th St for 1 block and Church will be on your left.
- † The event will be held ... rain or shine.

Why have a Grand Ultreya?

- † We have the opportunity to gather together again. Let us rejoice and be glad!
- † Our diocese is widespread geographically and it is rare that cursillists from the east and west all get together.
- † This is a time for cursillistas AND THEIR FAMILIES and friends to take part in a Cursillo event.


