1. Ultreya Center News:

- ◆ The **Hastings/Minden/Holdrege Ultreya Center** held its first Ultreya in over a year on Sunday, August 15, at 3:30 pm at St. John the Baptist Church in Minden (a potluck followed). The Ultreya Center plans to begin holding quarterly Ultreyas, with the next Ultreya scheduled for **Sunday, November 14 at 3:00pm at St. John the Baptist Church in Minden.**

Comments about Ultreya (from Kathy Rowell, Holdrege)

The Samaritan woman went to the well because she was thirsty. She needed something to quench her thirst – to revive and sustain her. At the well, the Samaritan woman had a conversation with Jesus, a Jew. She was amazed that a Jew would speak to a Samaritan woman. They came from different backgrounds. Although she went to the well to quench her thirst, Jesus told her of the Living Water that would also quench her soul.

We have all heard this story and maybe did not think it had a lot of relevance for us on our daily lives. What if we look at this story in a different way? Sometimes a change of perspective is all it takes to open our eyes to another point of view.

Reminders re: Ultreya and Group Reunion (especially invitations to non-cursillistas):

- **Any Ultreya is open to any cursillista and even non-cursillistas.**
- If your area is not holding regular Ultreyas, consider visiting a neighboring Ultreya Center.
- Also consider **inviting a non-cursillista** to experience **Ultreya or Group Reunion**, as these are ways of helping show/explain what Cursillo is. However, **BEFORE** you invite someone to a Group Reunion (whether that person is another cursillista or a non-cursillista), **first ask the permission of your group members**, as it is **very important to respect the confidentiality and privacy of what is shared by the members of your Group**. Also, keep in mind that a non-cursillista will not have the full understanding of the Cursillo Method without living the Three Day Weekend; thus, you **should make it clear that these are only “stepping stones”** leading to the Three Day Weekend and into the Fourth Day.
- The structure of what is shared at Group Reunion and Ultreya is **NOT a secret**. However, the details of what is shared **IS** confidential and **NOT** meant to be shared outside the group.

2. Precursillo

The Weekends scheduled for February 2011 may seem like they are a long way off, but they are not ... at least in terms of the work to be done in the Precursillo. The work of the Precursillo is ongoing, and NOT done solely in the few weeks leading up to the next set of Weekends. As a refresher, the Precursillo's stated **purposes** are: (1) to study environments; (2) to select candidates through friendship; (3) to sponsor; and (4) to prepare our friends (candidates). The stated **objectives** of the Precursillo are tied to the four purposes:

1. Study of environments

In essence, this involves a proper study of those places/situations in which we find ourselves, with an eye toward selecting candidates in those environments with the leadership qualities that will transform the environment into a Christian one. The environments we are called to study are not exclusively related to the Church or parish ... we must look at ALL environments with an eye toward how best to win them for Christ.

2. Selection of candidates through friendship

- A. Identify key persons within our environments.
- B. Selection of candidates through friendship.
- C. Selection of persons based on the effectiveness of the candidate as the leaven of his/her environment and circumstances.
- D. Insure that all candidates satisfy the basic requirements to participate in the Cursillo Weekend.

3. To sponsor

To support each candidate according to the responsibilities listed on the back of the Lincoln Diocese Sponsor Form (see diocesan webpage).

4. To prepare our friends (candidates)

To prepare our friends with a view toward Postcursillo.

Come to the October SOL, where the topic of discussion will be "**What is involved in sponsoring a candidate on a Cursillo Weekend?**" The October SOL is tentatively scheduled for **October 16, 2010 (re-scheduled** from Oct. 9), from 10:00am – 3:00pm (with Mass at 9:30am) at St. Ann Parish in Doniphan, NE.

If you know of persons who are hungry to know our Lord better, and who want to grow in their spiritual lives, begin to prepare them for a Three Day Weekend. Continue to offer Palanca, that God might give you eyes to see and ears to listen for those who want to know Him better ... We should study our environments (those around us) at all times in search of persons who can help Christianize the world ... **He's counting on you!!!**

As always, the registration form for Three Day Weekend is available from the Cursillo of Lincoln website (<http://webpages.charter.net/seas/cursillolincoln.html>). **Please use the most recent forms**, as information has changed. The Registration Form should be filled out by the candidate and returned to you as the sponsor; you should fill out the Sponsor Form (and be prepared to fulfill the sponsor responsibilities described on the back of the form), including getting the candidate's pastor's signature, and send the Registration Form and Sponsor Form together with the registration fee (\$20) to the Lay Director (address on the form).

3. Three Day Weekend

The next Three Day Weekends are scheduled for February 2011 at St. John the Baptist Parish in Minden ... who do you know that should be there? The Weekends are:

- Men's Weekend: February 10-13, 2011
- Women's Weekend: February 24-27, 2011

Regional Encounters begin at approximately 8:00 p.m. on Friday evening (registration prior to opening) and conclude with the Ultreya on Saturday evening (Sunday morning Mass and breakfast are provided on Sunday morning; sack lunches for those traveling are also provided). **This is SO close for our Diocese ... make plans now to be there to share in the work of Cursillo with others in our region!!**

5. School of Leaders (SOL)

The next SOL will be **October 16, 2010 (changed from October 9)**, at St. Ann Parish in Doniphan (*see the enclosed registration form on the inside of the mailing cover*). As usual, the day will begin with Mass at 9:30 a.m., followed by 10:00am Group Reunion, the technique talks and work sessions, and the doctrinal talk.

The technique talks for the next SOL will focus on the Precursillo. First, we will discuss the purpose of the Cursillo Movement and the importance of the Cursillo Method (see Fr. Seiker's article under "From the Spiritual Advisor"), and then focus on the Study of the Environment and the how's and why's and what's of selecting candidates and sponsoring candidates to the Three Day Weekend. In studying the Precursillo in this manner, the talks will naturally show how the three areas of the Movement (Precursillo, Cursillo, and Postcursillo) fit together. It will be a great way to better understand Cursillo itself. The doctrinal talk relates to topics that will help you to continue to grow in your spiritual life ... on-going metanoia!

Please consider helping with the work of Cursillo. There are many, many areas in which to contribute. This is not about "qualifying" you to give a rollo on a Weekend ... it is about doing all those things which are necessary to keep Cursillo alive and well in the Diocese. From the Spiritual Advisor

In his homily on EWTN on Wednesday, August 18, 2010, Fr. Mark Mary, referred to a paragraph from Pope John Paul II's Apostolic Exhortation: "The Church in Europe". Fr. Mark Mary observed that much of what is said in this exhortation could also apply to the Church in America. He specifically quoted the follow passage:

"Everywhere, then, a renewed proclamation is needed even for those already baptized. Many Europeans today think they know what Christianity is, yet they do not really know it at all. Often they are lacking in knowledge of the most basic elements and notions of the faith. Many of the baptized live as if Christ did not exist: the gestures and signs of faith are repeated, especially in devotional practices, but they fail to correspond to a real acceptance of the content of the faith and fidelity to the person of Jesus. The great certainties of the faith are being undermined in many people by a vague religiosity lacking real commitment; various forms of agnosticism and practical atheism are spreading and serve to widen the division between faith and life; some people have been affected by the spirit of an immanentist humanism, which has weakened the faith and often, tragically, led to its complete abandonment; one encounters a sort of secularist interpretation of Christian faith which is corrosive and accompanied by a deep crisis of conscience and of Christian moral practice.(80) The great values which amply inspired European culture have been separated from the Gospel, thus losing their very soul and paving the way for any number of aberrations.

"When the Son of man comes, will he find faith on earth?" (Lk 18:8). Will he find faith in our countries, in this Europe of ancient Christian tradition? This is an open question which clearly reveals the depth and the drama of one of the most serious challenges which our Churches are called to face. It can be said as the Synod emphasized that this challenge frequently consists not so much in baptizing new converts as in enabling those already baptized to be converted to Christ and his Gospel: (81) in our communities we need to be seriously concerned about bringing the Gospel of hope to all those who are far from the faith or who have abandoned the practice of Christianity." (Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation: The Church in Europe [June 28, 2003] #47).

What caught my attention was the reference to the "New Evangelization" that Pope John Paul II often referred to throughout his papacy. As cursillistas, we are called to be a part of that "New Evangelization". Christ called us during our Three Day Weekend to conversion ... to metanoia. That conversion is an ongoing work. Everyday we are to be more and more converted to Christ and to His Gospel. The Lord desires that this conversion take place not only in us but in all people. Christ is counting on us to "Christianize our environments". He wants us to bring the "Gospel of Hope to all those who are far from the faith or who have abandoned the practice of Christianity" as well as to those who are already Baptized.

How do we do this? We have been entrusted with the gift of the Cursillo Method ... Group Reunion and Ultreya. As we meet in our weekly Group Reunions and participate in Ultreya, we share our experiences of living our Catholic faith in the three areas of the tripod of Piety, Study, and Action. We are to challenge others and be challenged by them to live authentic lives of Piety and not just "go through the motions". We are to challenge others and be challenged by them to study our faith ... to really get to know our Lord deeper in a personal way and to know our Catholic faith better. We are to challenge others and be challenged by them to put our faith into Action ... and to make plans that are Apostolic ... how are we (as apostles) going to bring Christ into the environments in which He placed us? There are persons that each of us know ... persons that we meet in our daily

lives, who either don't know the Lord very well, or have fallen away from an active practice of the faith, or who are just "going through the motions". What's our plan to bring them back?

Others should be able to see in us ... in our faith lived out in our daily lives ... our love for the Lord and for His Church. Through meeting us, they should desire the goodness that they see in us ... and should say to us as the Gentiles said to Philip: *"Sir, we would like to see Jesus."* (Jn 12:21). May the Lord help each of us to be faithful to what has been given to us, and to live our Catholic faith and the Cursillo Method in such a way that we shall be an active part of the New Evangelization.

From the Lay Director

In my last note, I wrote about giving of self to serve others in and for the Cursillo Movement. At the 20th National Cursillo Encounter (July 29 – August 1, 2010 at Rockhurst University in Kansas City, MO), we "encountered" hundreds of those very people. For those of you who have attended either a Regional or National Encounter, you understand the joy of sharing the same love of Jesus with so many who feel the same way. Eight from our Diocese were there, so Lincoln was well represented.

The Encounter began on Thursday evening with a welcome, the keynote address, night prayers, exposition, and reconciliation. Fr. David Knight (author of "His Way", a book many of you may have read) gave the keynote address – "The Unprofitable Servant". He spoke about stewardship, and about the many people who are just living a good life but actually failing as stewards (recall the parable of the stewards and the man who buried his one talent out of fear). What Fr. Knight talked about really hit home, and I reflected on what I am doing with my talents – did I bury them, or am I "investing" them? If God is my life like I hope He is, why would I think of burying the wonderful treasures He gives me to share? Fr. Knight said we are stewards of everything – God does not hold back His gifts, rather, the decision is ours to do something with them or not. It is like the Ideal rollo – what do we do with our gifts?

At the Encounter, multiple presentations were given at the same time, so we tried to split up so at least one of us would hear each of the talks. The presentations covered many topics including: (1) Regional Service Team; (2) Essence, Purpose, and Mentality [of the Cursillo Movement]; (3) Sponsoring a Friend to a Cursillo; (4) Regional Secretariat; (5) The Role of the Cursillo Leader; (6) Friendship Group Reunion; (7) Diocesan Secretariat; (8) Spirituality of the Cursillo Leader; (9) Ultreya; (10) Criteria for Authenticity; (11) Dangers and Deviations; and (12) Persevering in the Fourth Day. Each presentation was followed by small group discussion and then a summary of what was discussed in the groups. A common theme emerged in that most misunderstandings in the Movement appear to come from a lack of studying the most basic Cursillo literature (e.g., the Leaders' Manual). The overriding desire of those participating was to be faithful to the charism of the Movement and to implement, where needed, changes to return to authenticity. We need to pray and offer much palanca for dioceses that struggle, and that cursillistas in our own diocese might continue to grow in their understanding and living of Cursillo.

Again, I ask that you consider becoming more active in Cursillo. Start by being faithful to your friendship group, and if you're not grouping, then consider joining/starting one. Come to Ultreya. Consider participating in the School of Leaders. We need each other – God wants us to be community. Let us all pray for each other always.



DIRECTIONS FROM OMAHA TO NORFOLK, NE

Go WEST on US-6 W/Dodge St, continuing onto Dodge Road and later State Hwy 28B (Link). Merge onto US-275 N, then take US-77/US-275 W ramp to Norfolk/So. Sioux City (keep right at the fork), and continue toward **US-275 N/US-77 N** and merge onto **US-275 N/US-77 N** (continue to follow US-275 N for 71 miles). Turn right at NE-24 W / US-275 BUS N for 1.1 miles. Then turn left at NE-35 W / US-275 BUS N for 2.4 miles. Turn left at So. 18th Street and go approximately 400 feet, then take the 1st right onto Madison Ave. (for 0.4 miles). Sacred Heart Elementary School will be on your left.

DIRECTIONS FROM LINCOLN TO NORFOLK, NE

Take I-80 W to NE-15 N (Seward exit 379), and turn NORTH. Continue NORTH on NE-15 for about 26-1/2 miles. Turn left at NE-92 / 32 Rd and follow NE-92 W for 14-1/2 miles. Then turn right at US-81 N and continue to follow US-81 N for 60-1/2 miles. Turn LEFT at US-275 N, and follow US-275 N for 1.3 miles. Turn right at S. 25th St. and go 0.3 miles, then turn right at Madison Ave and go another 0.3 miles. Sacred Heart Elementary School will be on your right.

DIRECTIONS FROM SIOUX CITY TO NORFOLK, NE

Locust St. for 2-1/2 miles. At US-30 (W. 1st St.), turn right and continue to follow US-30 east for about 62-1/2 miles. Turn left on US-30 E / US-81 N for 2 miles, then turn left at 23rd St. for 0.8 miles. Then continue onto US-81 N for 42.8 miles, and turn left at US-275 N, and follow US-275 N for 1.3 miles. Turn right at S. 25th St. and go 0.3 miles, then turn right at Madison Ave and go another 0.3 miles. Sacred Heart Elementary School will be on your right.
