Looking Back, Looking Forward During 2019, we celebrate the Silver Anniversary of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish which was officially created by Bishop Fabian Bruskewitz on June 13, 1994. However our history goes back another 30 years.

Shortly after the Diocese of Lincoln celebrated its 75th Anniversary, planning for St. Elizabeth Ann Seton parish started in 1964 when Fr. John Glaves, the pastor of St. James Parish in Curtis, worked with Bill Pendergast and Clarence Frazier (former North Platte mayor) to conduct a census of those Catholics who lived south of the South Platte River. At that time there were approximately 35 families. Due to lack of funds, Bishop Casey did not invest in land at that time. The closest Parishes in the Lincoln Diocese were in Curtis, Wellfleet, and Farnam. In January 1970, through the forethought of Bishop Glennon Flavin, the Diocese of Lincoln purchased the approximately 10 acres of land on which St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish Hall, Rectory, and Church have been built.

Fr. Gary Brethour was assigned as the first Pastor of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish on June 13, 1994 when the Parish was officially created by Bishop Fabian Bruskewitz. Brethour was also the Pastor of St. James Church in Curtis, St. William Church in Wellfleet, and St. Joseph Church in Farnam. During the last weeks of June, and during July, and August, Fr. Brethour met with the Parishioners of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish and began inviting them to respond to God's graces and form a Parish family.

The first Sunday Mass was held on Sunday, August 21, 1994 at 8:00am in the Student Lounge area at the Vocational Technical campus of Mid-Plains Community College. Volunteer Parishioners arrived early to set up student lounge for Mass, using one of the tables for the Altar, a "portable/temporary" tabernacle (used for before & during Mass), as well as the arranging the chairs. Volunteers also made kneeling cushions for parishioners to use to kneel on rather than the tile floor of the student lounge. Fr. Brethour was available in a "temporary" Confessional for 30 minutes before Mass.

After Mass, parishioners volunteered to bring rolls and coffee and serve them in order to provide the opportunity for Parishioners to meet and get to know each other and begin to form our family spirit of our Catholic Parish. Fr. Brethour commented that parishioners were very willing to help in any way they could.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... In recent years, there has been remarkable progress in drawing persons with disabilities into full celebration. Now it is generally accepted that worship places need accommodations such as ramps or elevators, large-print materials for those who are sight-impaired, and perhaps even an assisted hearing system or signing in American Sign Language. American Sign Language is not merely English translated into movement, but a distinct language with its own grammar, syntax (word order), and vocabulary. For this reason, the American Catholic bishops have approved American Sign Language (ASL) as an official language of the liturgy. Celebrating liturgy in our own language (the vernacular) means that liturgy must be accessible to all languages and cultures. The fact that Mass is celebrated this weekend in some places in total silence, but with the full participation of deaf people praising God in the movements of their hands, and sometimes even with a priest who is deaf, is nothing less than the Church being faithful to the image of Jesus, who made the deaf hear and the mute speak. Remember too that deafness is an invisible disability, and that there may well be people in your parish who are quietly yearning for Mass to be signed for them in ASL. —James Field, Copyright © J. S. BLESSED ... When we think of the word "Beatitude" we think of today's discourse from Luke's Gospel, or the more familiar one from Matthew (which begins "Blessed are the poor in spirit ..."). Actually, beatitudes occur throughout the prophets and Gospels. Today in Jeremiah (with an echo in the psalm) we hear, "Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord" (Jeremiah 17:7). Following his resurrection in John's Gospel, Christ proclaims, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed" (John 20:29). The evangelists placed these sayings throughout the Gospels as short reminders about the characteristics that one will find in a follower of Christ, characteristics that will help spread the Good News in this life and lead to eternal blessings in the next. In Latin, the saints are called the Beati, the "Blessed," for they are the ones who lived the "blessed" life as described by Jesus throughout the Gospels.
