Looking Back and Moving Forward Fr. Gary Brethour lived in the rectory at St. James Church in Curtis, during June, July, and August. During the months of September and October, he lived part of the week in an apartment at Frontier Resort at Lake Maloney in order to be more accessible to parishioners at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton.

In early August 1994, arrangements were made to purchase a house that was owned by Mrs. Patricia Pelton (which was location at the Southeast corner of the current intersection of Walker Road and Buffalo Bill). Fr. Brethour said: “It all happened very fast, and by the grace of God it all fell into place.” The closing date on the house / temporary rectory was October 4, 1994. Fr. Brethour invited Parishioners to come to the new Rectory to have a “Paint Party” (painting some of the walls which had not been painted for 15 years, and doing some light carpentry work). Fr. Brethour said: “This is your big chance to dump some paint on Fr. Brethour. (But remember, I don’t get mad, I get even!)”.

During August, September, & part of October, Mrs. Ardis Ginapp opened her home to parishioners to come to daily morning Mass 2-3 weekdays a week. In mid-October, daily Masses were held at the new Rectory 2-3 days each week.

Fr. Brethour was officially installation of Pastor on St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, St. James, Curtis, St. Joseph, Farnam, and St. William, Wellfleet by Msgr. Daniel Pohl (*the Dean of the Deanery and Pastor of St. Catherine Church in Indianola*) on September 25, 1994 at St. James Church, Curtis. Fr Brethour commented: “Many people have asked, ‘How do you manage everything?’ The answer is, I am blessed with wonderful parishioners! Your prayers and support and the grace of our Lord Jesus make all good things possible!”

Fr. Brethour wrote in the Oct. 16, 1994 Bulletin: “When I have told other priests in the Diocese about your piety, enthusiasm and generosity, they have commented that this is an ideal parish, or a pastor’s ‘dream parish.’ I agree. Thank you for making our parish the great parish it is.”

CCD classes started in November. Grades K-8 met on Saturdays, and High School met on Monday evenings. In November the Trustees (*Paul Nordquist and Ray Slowinski*) were appointed by Fr. Brethour as well as coordinators for the various volunteers to set up and taken down for Sunday Masses at the Student Lounge area at the Vocational Technical campus of Mid-Plains Community College, and coordinators for Coffee and Rolls after Mass. In December 1994, the following persons were elected to the Parish Council (*Charles Barron, Sharon Beckius, Paul Muchlinski, Ed Rieker*) and to the Parish Building Committee (*Reiny Burbach, Jim Dodson, Ed Portz, Luke Ranck, Jane Schmid*). Fr. Brethour commented: “We have come a long ways in just six months.”

Our first Parish Mission was held from Sun. Jan. 8 - Fri. Jan. 13, 1995. The talks were given by Fr. Milton Thomas, a priest from the Crosier Monastery in Hastings. These dates were chosen because they were near January 4, which is the feast day of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton). The Mission talks were at 7:30pm at the Holiday Inn: Sun, Jan 8 “Marriage”; Mon, Jan 9 “Divine Mercy”; Tue, Jan 10 “Reconciliation”; Wed, Jan 11 “Eucharist”; Thu, Jan 12 “Prayer and the Blessed Virgin Mary”; Fri, Jan 13 “Eucharist”.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... When the Roman Empire turned a favorable eye toward the once-persecuted Christians, among the effects was a population explosion in the baptismal font, as Christian sympathizers stepped from the shadows. With more and more people becoming Christians, laws were passed to protect Sunday as a work-free day. Soon, it became possible to celebrate Mass later in the morning, rather than the older custom of gathering before dawn to celebrate Eucharist. Amazingly, despite the increasing numbers of Christians, there was great resistance to adding to the number of worship events; the Eucharist that began as a few friends around a table soon was transformed into a more formal event with throngs crowding a large hall. All the Christians in a city or town would gather around the bishop for the one Sunday Eucharist, and only when the crowds became unmanageable was there an impulse to divide the assembly by splitting off a new bishop and flock. Now, sixteen hundred years later, many parishes see a need to trim or combine Mass schedules. This is often seen as tough surgery. Yet our forebears in the faith would see it as a gain: a filling up of the Eucharist with a large and vigorous assembly, a fullness of ministry, an opportunity to make the Church more fully visible and stronger for service. —James Field, Copyright © J. DO NO HARM ... We listen quite a while before we get to the "punch line" of the first reading today: even though it would be an easy thing to do, David will not harm the anointed one of the Lord. We, of course, know that Jesus is the Messiah, the anointed one of God, but the Bible uses this term for many different people. It is scripture's way of indicating who has been chosen by God for a special place and mission in salvation history. In today's Gospel, Jesus presents a greatly enlarged list of those who, as children of God, we should not harm, but love instead: our enemies, those who curse us or do us harm, those who owe us money, the ungrateful, the wicked. The point of Jesus' teaching is not to encourage these kinds of behaviors in others, but rather to form us in the image of our heavenly Father by increasing our opportunities to love unconditionally, expecting no return; to be merciful and forgiving, even when it would be easier not to. — Copyright © J. 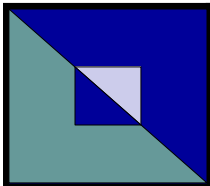
