Looking Back and Moving Forward

During November 1996, a number of men from the parish built the storage shed (on the Southeast corner of the Parking Lot) that is still being used today. They pulled nails out of old lumber and used shared their carpentry skills. Fr. Brethour wrote: "This storage building is a great example of the resourcefulness, perseverance, and the willingness to serve that is a part of our parish. Inspiring! Thank you!"

On Saturday, Jan. 4, 1997 (*feast day of our patron saint, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton*), the parish celebrated by having a soup supper and card games night following the 6:00pm evening Mass.

In February 2, 1997 Bulletin, Fr. Brethour wrote "The dirt piles to the south of our parish hall is soil that was given to us. We will level it out, plant some type of cover vegetation on it, and wait for the day when we will use it – when we build the Church and rectory. Rough estimate: \$5,000 to \$6,000 worth of material has been hauled in for free!!! God continues to bless us."

In January 1997, Fr. Joe Walsh and Dr. Kathy Benes (both from Catholic Social Services) came to our Parish to work with our Parish Council to formulate a set of values and goals and a mission statement. The following mission statement was the fruit of their discussions: "We, the parish council of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish, strive to do God's work by assisting our pastor through prayer, communication, action, and example, to please God." In the March 16, 1997 Bulletin, Fr. Brethour wrote: "Thank you to the following parishioners who participated in the process of discussion and prayer to formulate our Parish Mission Statement: Tom Allberry, Charles Barron, Jim Boots, Reiny Burbach, Dolly Frazier, Tom Karel, Don Kellogg, Bob Miller, Paul Nordquist, Dan O'Brien, Gary Ryland, Lauri Stadler, Betty Steffes, Mary Siebert. The discussions and this statement emphasized your wonderful commitment to Catholic education and love for Our *Eucharistic Lord Jesus.* It is interesting to note that these were the hallmarks of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton's life. It is no mistake that she is our patron saint! Our parish Mission Statement: 'Our mission as a Catholic parish family is to honor Our Eucharistic Lord Jesus through prayer, education, and service to others as exemplified by our patroness, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton."

In March 1997, five Parishioners: Peggy Thuman, Joan Ryland, Kwei Kucera, Kim Clouatre, and Fran Ranck volunteered to be Parish Nurses and to offer free monthly blood pressure screenings, starting April 19-20 after each Mass.

During Lent, members of our parish participated in a 6 lesson Bible Studey entitled: The Passion and Resurrection Narratives of Jesus. Msgr. John McCabe, (pastor of St. Cecilia, Hastings) preached a Parish Mission. Talks were: The apparitions at Fatima and sin and mortification; Our Lady of Fatima and the Angels; Our Lady of Fatima and Prayer; Our Lady of Fatima and the Eucharist. Msgr. McCabe gave our Parish a beautiful monstrance, which Fr. Brethour wrote is: "permanently on loan to our parish until we would get our own. (We do have a small monstrance of our own, but not nearly as nice as the one now on permanent loan to us.)"

On April 27, 1997, our parish sponsored a Mother Daughter Program coordinated by Laurie Stadler. In June 1997, parishioners were encouraged to "show your pride and support for our St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish by purchasing a license plate frame. Available in black with white letters, or white with black letters for \$5.00 each.

From April - July 1997, money donated to the Change Jar was designed to purchase enough walking sprinklers and hoses to water the lawn around the parish hall. Cost is about \$600. (Paul Nordquist donated pipe & sprinklers in summer of 1996). The thought was that by switching to the hoses, one person could move the hoses without a strained back. In late August, we interviewed and received bids from three local sprinkler system companies. North Platte Lawn Irrigation had low bid of \$3,400.00. Fr. Brethour received a \$2,000.00 donation from an old friend of the parish, & thus our parish contracted with N.P. Lawn Irrigation to put in an underground sprinkler system to water the grass around the parish hall.

On Sunday, Sept, 7, 1997, we held a Parish Ice Cream Social. Parishioners were encouraged to save your coffee cans. They used small cans that fit inside the larger cans. The kids rolled them on the sidewalk or parking lot to make ice cream!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... The Gospel today sees Peter and his colleagues after the Resurrection, returning to Galilee and resuming the family business. They are fishing by night. Although it is true that fish feed by night, the mention of darkness here is more about the human spirit than it is about fishing advice. Modern life keeps darkness effectively under control; much of the world has been glowing radiantly through the night for a century. Yet just as surely as the Risen Christ breaks into Peter's fishing, so does he break into the usual patterns of our own darkness, electric lights notwithstanding. It is Easter, and we are the people of the light.

In our tradition, Evening Prayer, celebrated in monasteries, parishes, cathedrals, and homes everywhere, is a kind of solemn protest against the darkness and its claims, an act of praise for our light-bearing God, and a commitment to carrying that light forward. Sunset is a turning point of our day, felt less acutely in an electrified world, but still an effective reminder that one day darkness overtakes us all. Yet our Eastering has taught us in a hundred ways that the victory belongs to the Bearer of Light. Easter summons us to transform our everyday "blackouts," perhaps in a way as simple as a whispered prayer of thanks at evening for the blessings of the day. —James Field, Copyright © J. S. LIFELONG SERVICE ... "I am going fishing." What an announcement! If asked who made it, and not told it was a Bible quote, we might guess "Grandpa" or "Uncle Fred," or admit, "I said that last summer!" But it is a Bible quote, from today's Gospel. The person who said it also once declared, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Yes, it's Peter! So today's announcement seems quite the comedown. Last Sunday Jesus said, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." But Peter seems determined to return to his pre-apostolic occupation, until Jesus intervenes, making Peter's later announcement deeper, "Lord, you know that I love you," and Peter's apostolic calling clearer, "Tend my sheep." Peter does so. Acts presents the consequences: Peter declares, "We must obey God rather than men." As Revelation proclaims, "Worthy is the Lamb"—to receive Peter's lifelong service, and ours. 




