Thanksgiving ... in 1½ weeks, we celebrate Thanksgiving. The word "Eucharist" means "Thanksgiving". Every time we are present at Mass, we are expressing our thanks to the Father for the gift of the Body, Blood, Soul, & Divinity of His Son Jesus in the Eucharist. So, every day that we are at Mass is Thanksgiving Day in a sense.

Thanksgiving Mass ... there will be a <u>9:00am Mass on</u> <u>Thanksgiving Day</u>. Thank the Lord with your fellow parishioners.

CONTEMPLATIVE SISTERS (Pink Sisters & Carmelite Sisters) COLLECTION ... For over forty-five years now, our Diocese has been blessed to have a Religious Community of Sisters who spend the greatest part of their day before the Blessed Sacrament in their Chapel, praying for us. This community is affectionately known as the Pink Sisters, since the color of their religious habit is pink! It has been a custom in our Diocese to express our thanks to the Pink Sisters by taking up a <u>special collection on</u> <u>Thanksgiving Day</u> for the Pink Sisters. In the last eighteen years, our Diocese has been blessed with another contemplative community of religious Sisters, the Carmelites, *(whose Convent is near Valparaiso)*. Consecration to Jesus through Mary ... I highly encourage each of our parishioners to participate in the Consecration to Jesus through Mary. There are short daily meditations (5-6 min each) and also daily prayers (in print and audio files; it might be helpful to some persons to click on the audio file link in one browser window and then in another browser window to click on the prayers/text link ... in this way, you can listen and read at the same time, thus using more senses to apply the message to your life). There are also 2-3 paperback books of the Consecration prayers available for those who do not have and/or use the internet.

Stewardship ... God wants all of us to be Saints, and to proclaim the Gospel by our actions as well as with our words. Jesus wants to use our weaknesses, wounds, and inadequacies, to allow His Light and His Glory to shine through us. St. Paul said "When I am weak, it is then that I am strong" ... that Christ shines through me!

weak, it is then that I am strong" ... that Christ shines through me! One area of Stewardship that is often overlooked and needs to be put first, is the <u>Stewardship of our Time</u>. God has given each one of us the same 24 hours each day and the same 168 hours every week. Each one of us should ask ourselves: How am I using the time that God has given to me? Reflect on your day or your week.

Another area of Stewardship that is overlooked is the **Stewardship of our Talent**. God has blessed each of us with various talents. Share them with your Parish Family ... share them with others. Reflect on your gifts and talents. <u>Complete the Gifts and Talents Survey Form</u> (one form for each person, adult & high school student); <u>put in Collection Basket next Sat/Sun</u>.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... Veterans Day began with the signing of a symbolic treaty between the Allies and Germany ending World War I (then called the "Great War") on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. The auspicious date was actually a well-established religious holiday, the feast of Saint Martin of Tours, a beloved soldier saint of the army of Rome. After World War II, Armistice Day was changed to Veterans Day in the United States and Remembrance Day in Britain, but of course the feast of Saint Martin endures. Martin was named after Mars, the god of war, and against the advice of his parents he went on his own to church. He became a catechumen at the age of ten. By fifteen he was enlisted in the cavalry in France. Coming across a poor man, Martin had an impulse to divide his bright red soldier's cape and clothe him. He later had the insight that he had served Christ, and the other half of his cape became a lifelong sign to him of his duty to serve the poor. Housed in a tiny church capella or "chapel," the cape became a great object of pilgrimage on the way to Compostella, and a favored place for the prayers of soldiers. Martin was not so eager to serve as bishop as he had been as a soldier, and legend says that he hid in a barn filled with geese to avoid episcopal election. To this day, the customary meal for November 11 is goose! Traditionally, this is the last feast day before winter closes in, and begins a period of fasting once known as "Saint Martin's Lent" or "Martinmas," that later developed into the season of Advent. –Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

THE CALL TO DISCIPLESHIP ... The core vocation in the Gospel of Mark is the vocation, or call, to discipleship. Today's Gospel passage provides us with one last example of what the vocation to discipleship means, and one example of what it doesn't mean. A destitute widow shows us that discipleship means following Jesus' way of service, even if it requires giving one's livelihood (or life). The scribes show us by their bad example that discipleship should entail a vocation to extend God's care to those who are most in need. In our reading from the book of Kings another widow and her son are close to death. They too give what little they have, but they are rewarded by Elijah with food enough for a year. And the reading from the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that Jesus sacrificed his life "to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him" *(Hebrews 9:28).* $_{-Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.$
