#### **Looking Back and Moving Forward ....**

Summer CCD was held in June 1999 with 31 students participating. Sr Rosaline and Sr. Elizabeth, from the Marian Sisters & Betty Steffes were teachers. Other parents assisted.

Prior to Fr. Brouillette's being assigned as Pastor, the possibility of beginning a Knights of Columbus Council in our Parish, with members from St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, Wellfleet, Curtis, and Farnam, had been discussed and a planning meeting was held on June 17, 1999. After the Sunday Masses in July, Scott Monzon visited with men who were interested in starting a new Council. Sunday, July 25, 1999, there was a 1st Degree Initiation followed by the official formation of the council and election of officers. Chaplin: Fr. Tom Brouillette; Grand Knight: Scott Monzon; Financial Secretary: Chris Pasquinelly; Deputy Grand Knight: Jerry Beckius; Chancellor: James Boots; Recorder: Mike Paul; Treasurer: Paul Coder; Advocate: Bob Merrigan; Warden: Kent Blackman; Inside Guard: Ron Jones; Outside Guard: Mark Stadler; Trustee for 1 year: Jerry Steffes; Trustee for 2 years: Marvin Greenwood; Trustee for 3 Years: Ed Portz. Weeks later, we received the official "Charter" Document which now hangs in our Parish Hall.

In the August 1, 1999 Bulletin, Fr. Brouillette wrote: "The parish council met Sunday, July 25. We spoke about possible goals for which the money returned to us from the Crossing the Threshold Campaign could be used. The committee for the campaign has also discussed the possibilities for which money could be used. After much discussion, thought & prayer, the goal which has been designated for the campaign money that is returned to us is the following: Paying off the rectory mortgage & using whatever money is left over towards the building / construction of the new rectory. Once the new rectory is built, with money coming from the campaign & sale of the present rectory, the campaign for building the new church can begin. The reason the rectory will be built before building the church is because of numbers. We have about 105 households on our books. With this campaign, many of our people will be unable to pledge anything towards the new church for at least three years; but in the meantime, we would be able to get the rectory built & paid for. Then, with no debts in the parish & with people finishing off their campaign pledges, we'll be able to begin the drive for the church.'

In August 1999, Fr. Brouillette began having monthly meetings with the Lectors, Acolytes, and Ushers, usually on the first Saturdays of the month. He also started having a Holy Hour with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on the first Saturdays of the month.

A number of parishioners suggested to Fr. Brouillette that since he only has one Parish, it would be good if the 11:00am Sunday Mass could be a little earlier. Previously Fr. Brethour had an 8:30am Mass in Wellfleet. Fr. Brouillette responded by writing in the August 1, 1999 Bulletin: "Bishop Bruskewitz's ground rule for new pastors is 'Don't change anything for at least one year!' If he said it once: he has said it a hundred times, and I'm not exaggerating. I must be obedient to him and 'follow him as if I am following Christ.'"

Fr. Brouillette met with Grant Creager, an architect who was a member of the Parish, to have him make some drawings for a new Rectory.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... The paschal candle, blessed at the Easter Vigil, carried in procession into the darkened church, and aflame with the light of Christ to be passed hand to hand to renew our baptism, burns for the fifty days of Easter whenever we gather as Christ's risen body. In the last fifty years, we have grown to see this candle as the sign of Christ's enduring presence with us. Before then, it was often seen more as a kind of signpost pointing backwards to events in Christ's life. Therefore, in some places, on the fortieth day after Easter, in order to portray the disappearance of Jesus at the Ascension, the candle was hidden. Now we see the paschal candle as a sign of the great baptismal season of grace and it remains in a prominent place throughout the entire fifty days. We do know of some churches that did not hide the candle after the Ascension. In England before the Reformation, the candle was left in place for fifty days, since on Pentecost Eve there was a vigil, and the candle was used to consecrate the waters of the font. In Salisbury cathedral, the candle was thirty-six feet high, and in Westminster Abbey weighed over three hundred pounds. On Pentecost, the candles were melted to make tapers for the funerals of the poor. —James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

**IN BETWEEN** ... In between: we all find ourselves there from time to time – sometimes uncomfortably. Like in between money coming in and money going out, earning income and paying bills. In between customer and manager, diner and chef: any honest server trying to serve both. In between theory and practice, ideal and reality: everyone from parents to pastors. Ask the kids – or parishioners! This Sunday, in between Ascension and Pentecost, reminds us we're in between Jesus' departure and glorious return – sometimes uncomfortably. Though Jesus promises in Revelation, "I am coming soon," Acts shows Stephen tragically called home first. But Pope Francis urges us not to become "sourpusses," as if living Gospel love is impossible in between. Today's Gospel shows Jesus praying for those about to betray, deny, and desert him, but also praying "for those who will believe in me through their word." Us! "So that they" – we – "may all be one."


