Looking Back and Moving Forward

Fr. Brouillette wrote in Feb. 27, 2000 Bulletin: "St. Theresa of Avila, one of the three female doctors of the Church, said if we give up one sin per year we will soon be perfect. Perhaps for our children we could ask them to give up one of their own particular faults or sins until Easter." He also wrote: "The money raised in the change jar during Lent will go to the Lincoln Connection." and also: "We will have a 'wild' time if you come and join the festivities for Fat Tuesday, March 7th, 6-8:00pm at the parish hall. Hope you can come & watch the rectory mortgage papers burn."

In the March 5, 2000 Bulletin, Fr. Brouillette wrote: "Don your camouflage or hunter orange togs. Taste, savor & sample the wild game. Join in the spirit of Fat Tuesday on Wild-West Walker Road. Music, food, fun & prizes. March 7th, from 6:00-8:00pm @ the Parish Center. Jeans & boots welcome. No charge! Just bring your appetite & be prepared to enjoy the culinary arts!"

In the March 12, 2000 Bulletin, Fr. Brouillette wrote: "Debt Free: A check for \$2,000 was sent to the Bishop on Tuesday, March 7th, paying off the balance of the rectory. We celebrated during the wild game feed @ the hall on 'Fat Tuesday.'" He also wrote: "At our parish council meeting last week we spoke again about the new rectory. As of now, I am making a floor plan and will then take it to an architect to make sure everything works in relation to the new Church. Then we will compare prices from different companies and contractors. After this step, the building committee and I will take it to our Diocesan Building Commission for approval, suggestions and changes. I plan on having the rectory in the same location that Clarks-Anderson Architectural Firm placed it on the original site plan."

We celebrated parish renewal / parish mission on April 9 – 11, 2000. Fr. Joe Walsh, the director of Catholic Social Services of our diocese was the speaker.

In April 2000, we had Service Master clean the carpet in the Parish Hall. This meant moving the chairs and pews to one end of the Hall and then back. After Service Master finished cleaning the carpets, our parishioners had a general church cleaning. Also in April 2000, an anonymous donor gave our parish an Ambry set, which is the set of three vessels in which the Holy Oils are contained and displayed.

In the May 14, 2000 Bulletin, Fr. Brouillette wrote: "I wish to thank Eileen Boltz for her FIVE YEARS of acquiring the donuts & coffee & the help we need each week to serve them. If you see Eileen, please thank her for her hard work &loyalty to our people." He also wrote: *"Thank you to the Daughters of Charity for their help in hosting the LDCCW. The Bishop had a good stay at the parish. He was also presented with a new black Stetson Cowboy Hat!"*

In the June 25, 2000 Bulletin, Fr. Brouillette wrote: "Jubilee Eucharistic Adoration: The celebration of the Jubilee 2000 Year of Grace and Favor from the Lord is an extra ordinary invitation to conversion and to benefiting from the Church's gift of indulgences which lessen or take away completely the temporal punishment due for our sin in purgatory. One of the specific ways of gaining the indulgence is time spent in Eucharistic Adoration. A Jubilee Eucharistic All Night Vigil in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is held on the first Friday of each month at our parish closes with a Holy Hour and Benediction (the blessing of the Eucharist). Sign-up is the last weekend and week of each month. If you would like to participate in the vigil and receive the indulgence, please sign up for a one hour time period when the sign-up board is placed in the gathering area. It is a great way to get to know the Lord and to let Him get to know you."

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... Today's feast, extending a dimension of Easter joy into Ordinary Time, reminds us that every aspect of worship centers on the mystery of God in three persons. At baptism, we are initiated into Christ *and* the Spirit. The Creed we recite at Mass every Sunday has its roots in the ancient celebration of baptism, when a new believer was questioned at the edge of the waters of the font with three questions: Do you believe in God, the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit? Three questions, three affirmations, three immersions into the saving waters. Because every liturgy abounds with references to the Trinity, not only in words but in blessings by the sign of the cross, this feast was not easily accepted into the calendar. Pope Alexander in the eleventh century remarked that the liturgy is so laden with praise of the Trinity that there was no need for a special feast. Two hundred years later, while in exile in France, Pope John XXII proclaimed the feast, but it was not until 1911 that Pope St. Pius X gave it status as a solemnity. A favorite image in art for today is the Icon of the Trinity, showing three glorious winged men seated at a table laden with bread and a cup of wine. It recalls Abraham's hospitality to angels and gives expression to the inner life of God, a life lived in relationship, a life poured out in abundance whenever Christians gather at the table of the Eucharist to give praise to the Father, in Christ, in the embrace of the Spirit. —James Field, Copyright © J. THIS IS THE HOLY TRINITY ... Today we celebrate the Holy Trinity, one of the most confounding mysteries of our faith. Through this mystery we experience our relationship to God: Creator, Savior, and Holy Spirit. This relationship is not easy to understand or to describe. It does not become clearer through analysis. Its complexity mirrors the complexity of all our relationships. We understand our relationships with our spouses, our children, our parents, and our friends only through daily give-and-take, annual rituals, and the life-changing moments we share. We understand our relationships only as we live them. The relationships we have with those we love, and who love us, sustain us through an uncertain and difficult life. This is the Holy Trinity. What is striking about today's readings is that each is incomplete. What they do offer is a description of a moment in our relationship, a memory of a time and an event when our relationship made sense even though that sense may be beyond our ability to describe fully. Often that is all that our faith offers, that is, a memory of what is possible, what is promised, what has been given. A memory of eternity, of love beyond understanding is to be cherished and nurtured even if not fully understood. This is the Holy Trinity. Copyright©J.S. Paluch Co.
