Thanks also to those who decorated our Altar so beautifully with flowers, and cared for them for 2 1/2 weeks. I apologize for this oversight!

Looking Back and Moving Forward

In the November 26, 2000 Bulletin, Fr. Brouillette wrote: "Father Brouillette extends an invitation to you to join him for parish Christmas dinner in St. Elizabeth's parish hall following Mass on Saturday, December 16th, 7:00pm to 10:00pm to show his appreciation for all you have done and continue to do for our parish of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. He would appreciate your reply by December 10th so food can be bought and prepared ahead of time. ... The menu consists of spaghetti, salad, hot bread and dessert. YUM!" He also wrote: "One of the devotions of' the Holy Year of the Great Jubilee of the Year 2000 celebrated by our parish is the first Friday Eucharistic Adoration and all night vigil, ending with a Holy Hour and Benediction at 10:00am Saturday. This will be the next to the last opportunity to gain the Great Jubilee 2000 indulgences as set by Bishop Bruskewitz. The Jubilee Year will officially close January 6th, 2001, which is the solemnity of the Epiphany in the general calendar of the Church. Pray that the Church has grown in following Christ's way of love and imitating it in all her actions; and that the devotion to the Real Presence of *Christ in the Eucharist will transform the way that people think* and that it will lead to greater unity in the world.³

In the January 21, 2001 Bulletin, Fr. Brouillette wrote: "Once again I am very pleased with the commitment so many of you have made to our Epiphany Adoration Program - Our gift to the Lord after the Jubilee Year of Favor. We still have 28 hours to be filled. I ask those of you who have not yet taken an hour to ask the Lord what He would like you to do. Christ says to his friends before his passion and crucifixion, 'My soul is sorrowful even to death; remain here, and watch with me.' And again in Matthew's gospel he says to Peter, 'So, could you not watch with me one hour? Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation ... ' If you have an inclination to sign up for an hour, try it. If it ends up not working for you we will find someone to fill the spot or you can change hours. Those of you who have signed up and committed to the program, please start going to your hour this week if you didn't do so last week. I also suggest you look for a substitute if you cannot be there. We will also be in need of people who can sub on particular days of the week. Let me know if you can do this. Lastly, this is a great program we have begun; therefore, there will be great resistance from the evil one. Please remember in your prayer the program and the people who have taken an hour .and those who are thinking about taking an hour. I purchased a ledger book for signing in at your hour. It will make a nice remembrance for our parish history. It will be in the entryway to the church. The Monstrance, which the parish council decided to purchase, is displayed at the back of church this weekend. Please take a look at this beautiful vessel, which will hold the Eucharist during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament The plans for the new rectory are coming along. Pat Clinch is the contractor. Please keep this project in your prayers that all goes well."

In May 2001 we closed the old post office box and mail was asked to be sent to 3301 Echo Drive, North Platte, NE.

Moving day from the first Rectory (near Buffalo Bill) was on June 10, 2001. "If you would like to help out with moving today, you are welcome to do so. It looks like we'll have a number of helping hands. If you can't make the move, come join us for a barbecue at the parish hall. We plan to begin at 2:00pm."

In the June 24, 2001 Bulletin, Fr. Brouillette wrote: "The deal is done on the old rectory. Mike and Jonna Arensdorf are the new owners. The rectory was sold for \$110,000. Closing costs made the net profit to us a total of \$108,617.91. This money will go towards payment of the new rectory."

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... Processions are life's journey distilled. We move with companions, aware that Christ accompanies us, as we move to the altar for Communion or to the font for baptism, or carry a loved one to a place of rest. In Europe, the season of pilgrimage is beginning now, and tens of thousands of people are moving by foot on well-worn paths. Some take as long as six weeks to walk the last few hundred miles of the medieval pilgrimage route to the Shrine of St. James the Apostle in Compostela, in northern Spain. Those who make the journey by foot, hiking, or by bicycle, have a kind of passport stamped at villages and monasteries on the road. When they present this document at the cathedral, they are given the emblem of a pilgrim, the scallop shell of St. James. High over their heads at Mass, a huge *botafumeiro* twirls clouds of sweet incense through the cathedral. Cynics say it is to mask the odor of smelly feet. The pilgrims know better. Seeing through the clouds the happy faces of those they met along the road, they recognize a foretaste of the welcome into heaven, and the joy of meeting loved ones in the Kingdom of God. —James Field, Copyright © J. RADICAL TRANSFORMATION ... On this Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the readings describe anything but an ordinary time. They are disturbing and they leave us disturbed. The Old Testament reading recounts a young man's radical break with the past to follow a new path. The Gospel describes how life as we know it is abruptly changed if we follow the call of Christ. The psalm and Paul assure us that such life-altering change is possible only because of the power of God's love. We are presented with a stark choice. To love as God loves, we must leave our old lives behind. We must leave behind not just the bad, the selfish, and the evil but the ordinary, our daily work, and the important, our families, our lives.
