Our faith is to be treasured, preserved, and lived, but it is also to be shared ... share your faith with a friend by coming to these RCIA classes.

Looking Back and Moving Forward

In the January 14, 2007 Bulletin Fr. Walsh wrote: "Herb Steffes designated a Knights of Columbus annuity in his estate for the New Church Fund. We received the gift last week \$57,632.50 and have deposited it with the Diocese in our New Church account. May God bless Herb, Eleanor and all the members of the Steffes family for their generosity to Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish."

In the January 21, 2007 Bulletin Fr. Walsh wrote: "Begin planning now for a great summer catechetical experience for your children. We have Totus Tuus coming to our parish in July 8 through 13. Totus Tuus will meet in the evening with our young people (High School) and during the day with our grade school children. We will invite the children & young people from parishes all around to join us for this week. It will be a great experience for our kids."

In the January 28, 2007 Bulletin Fr. Walsh wrote: "Janet and Steve Fear have graciously offered to host a Lenten Adult Education program for men and women of the parish. Catholic Answers developed the materials we will use for our program. I will be the teacher. The topics include contemporary issues that we face daily in our homes and work places. The survey in this bulletin lists the topics we will study. Sign up by indicating your preference for morning or evening meetings and the day of the week most convenient for you to meet."

In the February 4, 2007 Bulletin Fr. Walsh wrote: "The Finance Committee will meet on February 13 at 8:00pm. Included in our discussion will be the various facility issues in the parish (tile in the Church bathroom, painting and carpeting the Church, smaller maintenance and equipment needs for the Church) repairing the Church parking lot, small repairs in the Rectory, addressing the water issue under the rectory [presently it is dry], completing the electrical project for the Pumpkin Festival food booths, purchasing the computer for the office. Financing and appropriately sequencing these projects will be important. I am praying for a Holy Lent for us all." ... and from Parish Council minutes ... "Father Walsh suggested that the strategy for building the parish would include evangelization. Reiny Burbach mentioned the positive effect of the Christmas radio message within the Catholic community of North Platte, on both sides of the river. Father Walsh suggested that use of the media would be an important part of the evangelization strategy in the future."

In the Feb. 11, 2007 Bulletin Fr. Walsh wrote: "Since last August, we have registered three new families in our parish: Blake and Teresa Niesen, Matt and Amy Masek and most recently, Luke and Becky Deaver. All three families have already become involved in parish life: the Niesen's with playing music, singing, Catholic School and serving; the Masek's with our High School Youth Group & the Deaver's with our music ministry. Thank you all & welcome to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish!"

In the February 25, 2007 Bulletin Fr. Walsh wrote: "Bishop Bruskewitz gave me permission to proceed with the floor-covering project of the Parish Center, which includes raising the money and securing the services of a contractor to install our desired coverings. The committee to oversee this project composed of Toni Barron, Kathy Camby, Jane Schmid, Carol Torruella and myself, who met on Thursday to begin our discussions. We will develop a proposal and submit it to the Finance Committee for review and then present our idea to the parish community. It's a great spring project for Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish!"

In the March 25, 2007 Bulletin Fr. Walsh wrote: "The Parish Center Floor Covering Committee has completed its job and the Parish Finance Committee has signed off on the project. Samples of the materials we are recommending on display in the vestibule of our Parish Center. The cost of the project is \$16,527. This cost includes removal of all carpet and vinyl, and installation of the new materials, including the slate for the vestibule. As mentioned last week, I am interested in your input. Do you favor the project? Will you support it financially? Thank you ahead of time for your thoughtful consideration of these questions and providing me your input. A big thanks to the Committee for their work in pulling together this project."

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... When Pope Pius XII died in 1958, there was the usual buzz of speculation about likely successors. Cardinal Agajanian, Patriarch of the Armenians, was highly thought of as a likely choice. This took many Catholics by surprise, since he had never celebrated the same liturgy as Pope Pius, but followed ancient Armenian customs according to the Eastern Church, which veils the Eucharistic liturgy from sight by a series of curtains, and in which the priest kneels while the people stand for Communion. In the years that followed, the Second Vatican Council would affirm the dignity and independence of the Eastern Churches, in complete union with Rome, yet different in patterns of life and worship. We have the same faith, the same sacraments, and the same pope. Yet everywhere in the world our separate Churches are combined into families held together by the ministry of bishops. All of this serves as warning: If you ever say, "But we've always done it this way," you are on very thin ice indeed! —James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.
