**Baptism and Life** ... "Whoever is moved by love begins to perceive what "life" really is. He begins to perceive the meaning of the word of hope that we encountered in the Baptismal Rite: from faith I await "eternal life" - the true life which, whole and unthreatened, in all its fullness, is simply life. Jesus, who said that he had come so that we might have life and have it in its fullness, in abundance (*cf. Jn 10:10*), has also explained to us what "life" means: "this is eternal life, that they know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent" (*Jn 17:3*). Life in its true sense is not something we have exclusively in or from ourselves: it is a relationship. And life in its totality is a relationship with him who is the source of life. If we are in relation with him who does not die, who is Life itself and Love itself, then we are in life. Then we 'live'" – *Pope Benedict XVI, Encyclical on Hope, November 30, 2007.*

<u>Nominations for Parish Council</u> ... are being accepted for the next few weeks. Please contact one of the current Parish Council members or Parish Trustees (Members: Mickey Morlang, Jeff Orr, Kanen Hammond, Spencer Hampton,. Trustees: Jerry Volesky & Duane Johnsen) or Fr. Seiker to nominate another parishioner or yourself. Normally the terms for the parish council are for two years. We have 2 veteran members & 2 new members on the parish council each year. Hopefully there will be at least 4 parishioners' names on the ballot.

Joy of the Gospel Campaign ... The five year Combined Joy of the Gospel Campaign (Nov. 3, 2014 – Dec. 31, 2019) officially concluded on December 31, 2019. Our Parish Goal was \$750,000. We received **pledges of \$958,770**. By December 31, 2019 we received payments/gifts totaling \$880,183.05. At the end of last year, we still had a balance due on our DIAL Loan of \$61,613.45.

Since, December 31, 2019, some parishioners have continued to make payments/gifts to the Joy of the Gospel Campaign for a total of over \$50,000.00. Due to cash flow situations during this past year, we were not able to make many payments on our DIAL Loan. However, we were still accumulating interest on our loan.

On the opposite page of this bulletin, you will notice that in the last few weeks, some parishioners made donations to the Joy of the Gospel Campaign and/or the New Church Building Fund. <u>Thank you to those Parishioners who made</u> <u>donations!</u> With these donations, our DIAL Loan has been reduced to \$8,568.02. One of our Parish families said a few weeks ago that they would make a donation a few thousand larger than this remaining debt (*we are not sure about how much interest we will need to pay for October – December 2020*). With this promised donation, we should be able to retire our DIAL Loan completely. That would mean that St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church will be totally debt free when this remaining balance & interest are paid sometime in the next few months!

For a Parish of about 100 families *(average over 26 years)*, to do what we have done is very remarkable! <u>Thanks to all</u> of our Parishioners (past and present)!

**Payments on our DIAL Loan** ... We have been able to make **payments of \$1,759,678.04 on our DIAL Loan** (2012 = \$472,000.00; 2013 = \$209,600.00; 2014 = \$330,990.70; 2015 = \$187,735.50; 2016=\$114,068.84; 2017=\$132,465.00; 2018=\$176,620.00; 2019=\$80,948.00; 2020=\$55,250.00). These payments have**reduced our new Church loan from the original amount of \$1,485,000.00 to \$8,568.02**.

#### Catechism of the Catholic Church (Second Edition) PART FOUR – CHRISTIAN PRAYER SECTION ONE – PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE CHAPTER ONE – THE REVELATION OF PRAYER

#### God's Promise and the Prayer of Faith

**2570** When God calls him, Abraham goes forth "as the Lord had told him"<sup>8</sup>; Abraham's heart is entirely submissive to the Word and so he obeys. Such attentiveness of the heart, whose decisions are made according to God's will, is essential to prayer, while the words used count only in relation to it. Abraham's prayer is expressed first by deeds: a man of silence, he constructs an altar to the Lord at each stage of his journey. Only later does Abraham's first prayer in words appear: a veiled complaint reminding God of his promises which seem unfulfilled.<sup>9</sup> Thus one aspect of the drama of prayer appears from the beginning: the test of faith in the fidelity of God.

Abram went as the LORD directed him, and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he left Haran. *Gen.* 12:4

Q But Abram said, "O Lord GOD, what good will your gifts be, if I keep on being childless and have as my heir the steward of my house, Eliezer?" Cf. Gen. 15:2f. 2571 Because Abraham believed in God and walked in his presence and in covenant with him,<sup>10</sup> the patriarch is ready to welcome a

mysterious Guest into his tent. Abraham's remarkable hospitality at Mamre foreshadows the annunciation of the true Son of the promise.<sup>11</sup> After that, once God had confided his plan, Abraham's heart is attuned to his Lord's compassion for men and he dares to intercede for them with bold confidence.<sup>12</sup>

Abram put his faith in the LORD, who attributed it to him as an act of righteousness.

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram and said: I am God the Almighty. Walk in my presence and be blameless Cf. Gen. 17:1

"they asked him. <sup>a</sup>There in the tent," he replied. <sup>1</sup>Oone of them said, "I will surely return to you about this time next year, and Sarah was listening at the entrance of the tent, just behind him. <sup>1</sup>Now Abraham and Sarah were old, advanced in years, and Sarah had stopped having her womanly periods. <sup>12</sup>So Sarah laughed to herself and said, "Now that I am so withered and my husband is so old, am I still to have sexual pleasure?" <sup>13</sup>But the LORD said to Abraham: 'Why did Sarah laugh and say, 'Shall I really bear a child, old as I am?'' <sup>14</sup>Is anything too marvelous for the LORD to do? At the appointed time, about this time next year, I will return to you, and Sarah will have a son." <sup>15</sup>Because she was afrid, Sarah dissembled, saying, "I didn't laugh." But he said, 'Yes you did."

Lk* 1:26-38 <sup>26</sup>In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, <sup>27</sup>to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary. <sup>28</sup>And coming to her, he said, "Hail, favored one! The Lord is with you." <sup>29</sup>But she was greatly troubled at what was said and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. <sup>30</sup>Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. <sup>31</sup>Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. <sup>32</sup>He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, <sup>33</sup>and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." <sup>34</sup>But Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I have no relations with a man?" <sup>35</sup>And the angel said to her in reply, "The holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore, the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. <sup>36</sup>And behold, Elizabeth, your relative, has also conceived' a son in her old age, and this is the sixth month for her who was called barren; <sup>37</sup>for nothing will be impossible for God." <sup>38</sup>Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.

I mean to find out." <sup>22</sup>While the two men walked on farther toward Sodom, the LORD remained standing before Abraham. <sup>23</sup>Then Abraham drew nearer to him and said: 'Will you sweep away the innocent with the guilty? <sup>24</sup>Suppose there were fifty innocent people within it? <sup>25</sup>Far be it from you to do such a thing, to make the innocent die with the guilty, so that the innocent and the guilty would be treated alike! Should not the judge of all the world act with justice?" <sup>26</sup>The LORD replied, 'I find fifty innocent people? Will you destroy the whole city because of those five?
