CHAPTER ONE – THE REVELATION OF PRAYER

From this account, the spiritual tradition of the Church has retained the symbol of prayer as a battle of faith and as the triumph of perseverance.¹⁸

Taking one of the stones at the shrine, he put it under his head and lay down to sleep at that spot. "And there was the LORD standing beside him and saying: "I, the LORD, am the God of your forefather Abraham and the God of Isaac: the land on which you are lying I will give to you and your descendants.
