#### Catechism of the Catholic Church (Second Edition) PART FOUR – CHRISTIAN PRAYER SECTION ONE – PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE <u>CHAPTER ONE – THE REVELATION OF PRAYER</u>

2577 From this intimacy with the faithful God, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love,<sup>23</sup> Moses drew strength and determination for his intercession. He does not pray for himself but for the people whom God made his own.
