The People of Life, Born from the Cross ...

"When Jesus had received the vinegar, he said, 'It is finished'; and he bowed his head and gave up his spirit" (Jn 19:30). Afterwards, the Roman soldier "pierced his side with a spear, and at once there came out blood and water" (Jn 19:34). Everything has now reached its complete fulfillment. The "giving up" of the spirit describes Jesus' death, a death like that of every other human being, but it also seems to allude to the "gift of the Spirit", by which Jesus ransoms us from death and opens before us a new life. It is the very life of God which is now shared with man. It is the life which through the Sacraments of the Church - symbolized by the blood and water flowing from Christ's side - is continually given to God's children, making them the people of the New Covenant. From the Cross, the source of life, the "people of life" is born and increases" (The Gospel of Life, n.51).

LB364 Advances from Committee! ... We are now one step closer to giving educational freedom to more families and kids across the state! On Wednesday, LB364, the Opportunity Scholarships Act, was advanced by the Revenue Committee of the Nebraska Legislature. Sponsored & prioritized by Senator Lou Ann Linehan of Elkhorn, LB364 was voted out of committee with vote of 5-3.

LB364 would provide more scholarship opportunities for low-income children to attend a private school of their choice by creating an income tax credit for donations to scholarship granting organizations. Now it will be considered by the full Legislature & debated on the floor in April or May.

Catechism of the Catholic Church (Second Edition) **PART FOUR – CHRISTIAN PRAYER** SECTION ONE – PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE **CHAPTER ONE – THE REVELATION OF PRAYER** Elijah, the Prophets, and Conversion of Heart

2583 After Elijah had learned mercy during his retreat at the Wadi Cherith, he teaches the widow of Zarephath to believe in The Word of God and confirms her faith by his urgent prayer: God brings the widow's child back to life.³³ The sacrifice on Mount Carmel is a decisive test for the faith of the People of God. In response to Elijah's plea, "Answer me, O LORD, answer me," the Lord's fire consumes the holocaust, at the time of the evening oblation. The Eastern liturgies repeat Elijah's plea in the Eucharistic *epiclesis*. Finally, taking the desert road that leads to the place where the living and true God reveals himself to his people, Elijah, like Moses before him, hides "in a cleft of the rock" until the mysterious presence of God has passed by.³⁴ But only on the mountain of the Transfiguration will Moses and Elijah behold the unveiled face of him whom they sought; "the light of the knowledge of the glory of

33 Cf. 1 Kings 17:17-24. "Some time later the son of the mistress of the house fell sick, and his sickness grew more severe until he stopped breathing. "So she said to Elijah, "Why have you done this to me. O man of God? Have you come to me to call attention to my guilt and to kill my son?" ¹⁹Give me your son," Elijah said to her. Taking him from her lap, he carried him to the upper room where he was staying, and laid him on his own bed. ²⁰He called out to the LORD: "O LORD, my God, will you afflict even the widow with whom I am staying by killing her son?" ²¹Then he stretched himself out upon the child three times and called out to the LORD: "O LORD, my God, let the life breath return to the body of this child." ²²The LORD heard the prayer of Elijah; the life breath returned to the child's body and he revived. ²³Taking the child, Elijah brought him down into the house from the upper room and gave him to his mother. "See!" Elijah said to her, 'your son is alive." ²⁴Now indeed I know that you are a man of God, 'the woman replied to Elijah. "The word of the LORD comes truly from your mouth."
34 Cf. 1 Kings 19:1-14 Ahab told Jezebel all that Elijah had done – that he had put all the prophets to the sword. ³Jezebel then sent a messenger to Elijah and said, "May the gods do thus and so to me if by this time tomorrow I have not done with your life what was done to each of them." ³Elijah was afraid and fled for his life, going to Beer-sheba of Judah. He left his ney fave and ye your and afel asleep under the broom tree, but then an angel touched him and ordered him to get up and eat. ⁶He looked and there at his head was a hearth cake and a jug of water. After he ate and drank, he lay down again, 'but the angel of the LORD came back a second time, touched him, and ordered, "Get up and

LORD was not in the earthquake. ¹²After the earthquake there was the - but the LORD was not in the fire. After the fire there was a tiny whispening sound. ¹³When he heard this, Elijah hid his face in his cloak and went and stood at the entrance of the cave. A voice said to him, "Elijah, why are you here?" ¹⁴He replied, "I have been most zealous for the LORD, the God of hosts. But the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, torn down your altars, and put your prophets to the sword. I alone am left, and they seek to take my life." Cf. Ex. 33:19-23 ¹⁹He answered, "I will make all my beauty pass before you, and in your presence I will pronounce my name, 'LORD'; I who show favors to whom I will, I who grant mercy to whom I will. ²⁰But my face you cannot see, for no man sees me and still lives. ²¹Here," continued the LORD, "is a place near me where you shall station yourself on the rock. ²²When my glory passes I will set you in the hollow of the rock and will cover you with my hand until I have passed by. ²³Then I will remove my hand, so that you may see my back; but my face is not to be seen." **35** 2 Cor. 4:6 ⁶For God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to bring to <u>light the knowledge of the glory of God on the face of Jesus Christ.</u>

²⁷ *Cf Lk.* 9:30-35 ³⁰ And behold, two men were conversing with him, Moses and Elijah, ³¹ who appeared in glory and spoke of his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem. ³² Peter and his companions had been overcome by sleep, but becoming fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him. ³³ As they were about to part from him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good that we are here; let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." But he did not know what he was saying. ³⁴ While he was still speaking, a cloud came and cast a shadow over them, and they became frightened when they entered the cloud. ³⁵ Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him."
