Charity & Stewardship Appeal CSA 2020

(DDP)... due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, there is a different approach to CSA this year. Seiker (email or phone). The goal for St. Elizabeth Ann Seton is \$8,630.00. These funds will be used for various programs funded by the Charity & Stewardship Appeal (CSA 2020). Our Diocese is holding to CSA Appeal 1 month earlier than in the past!

Since we support a Catholic Grade School & High School, 80% of our goal & everything over our goal comes back to us, to help us provide Catholic education through our local Catholic School!

Just as we are one in the Body of Christ, we must remember that we are one with other parishes in our diocese. Once a year, our bishop asks each of us to make a commitment to support the work of our diocesan programs/ministries that provide services that no one parish could provide on its own. This effort is a means by which we can all work together to care for the Church by sharing the gifts God has granted us. Our goal is 100% participation. Please experience the joy of giving & join us as we work to continue God's work of spirituality, charity & education.

Over the last 26 years, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church has greatly benefited from The Charity and Stewardship Appeal (CSA): we have borrowed \$436,457.04 for Parish Hall, Rectory, & Farm. We borrowed \$1,485,000 for the new Church at very low interest rates. We have paid off loans for Parish Hall, Rectory, & "Farm". We still owe \$61,613.45 on Church loan. Litany to the Sacred Heart ... (on Good Friday)

... Join Archbishop José Gomez, (president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops and archbishop of Los Angeles), in a national moment of prayer in the time of the coronavirus. Together as a nation, we will pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and seek our savior's healing and protection. Visit https://lacatholics.org/sacred-heart/ or https://www.facebook.com/usccb to join the live-stream and pray as one nation on Good Friday, April 10, 2020 at 11:00amCT.

"By a special grant from the Apostolic Penitentiary of the Holy See for those who pray for the end of the pandemic, a plenary indulgence is available for those who join Archbishop Gomez in praying the Litany of the Sacred Heart on Good Friday. A plenary Indulgence removes all of the temporal punishment due to sins and may be applied to oneself or to the souls of the deceased [Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1471].

To receive this indulgence, a member of the faithful would need to **a**) pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart on Good Friday **b**) be truly repentant of any sins they have committed and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (at the earliest opportunity) **c**) pray for the Holy Father's intentions."

A Season of Grace ... Lent is a season of penance. Now, that sounds terribly negative to our modern thinking, but it does not mean that God's judgment is rising up out of spite or wrath. Rather, it means that this is a season of grace, where we are invited to put first things first and return to God. In Hebrew the word for repentance is shuv, and it means a turning back, a return to God. Lent should be a turning point where we start to prioritize the spiritual over the worldly. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... Most Christians today receive a bunch of palm fronds, olive branches, pussy willow, or forsythia (a relative of the olive) to carry in procession and to bear home in blessing. Some even offer sprigs of palm or other branches as a gesture of peace to those they have offended. The desire is to make a clean sweep of your spiritual house before the Easter feast. Accepting the branch is a token of the bearer's willingness to journey with the Church through a grateful remembrance of Jesus Christ's passion, death, and life giving resurrection. Traditionally, the plants associated with today's feast are planted in cemeteries as a sign of Christ's victory over death and the promise of new life. The joy of this day's opening procession soon gives way to a solemn reading of the Passion, this year according to Matthew. The ritual is meant not only to strengthen us to hear this account, but to stir us up to accompany the Church on this journey through Holy Week. It also prepares us for next Sunday's joyful renewal of our baptismal vows. —Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

HOSANNA ... "Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest" (Matthew 21:9). With these words the Church enters the holiest of weeks, commemorating the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ. When the people of Jerusalem cried out with their "hosannas," they were using an ancient Hebrew shout of acclamation that meant "Pray, save us." The king to whom they were shouting eventually would save them, but in a way that would be far from what they expected. Salvation would come from the wood of the cross as Jesus hung there to bring freedom from sin and life through death, opening the gates of heaven for all who put their faith and trust in him. - Copyright © J.
