P.3. The Beginning Steps of Prayer ... (by Father Gary Coulter, director, Our Lady of Good Counsel Retreat House)

In daily prayer we often do not have the luxury of being on a retreat. We go straight into prayer from some activity and our daily routine. So how I can enter into prayer and quiet my whirling thoughts, even in the midst of the busyness of the day? If we just rush straight from the midst of our activity into prayer, should we be surprised if our prayer is shallow, dry or distracted?

First, I suggest finding or making a place to pray. This can be in a Church or chapel of course, especially in the presence of our Lord in the Eucharist. But prayer can take place in your home, in your room, even taking a walk. You can set up a prayer corner in your home where you have some religious images, statues, or holy cards, and whatever books that are useful to your prayer, like a bible and journal. Perhaps a lit candle will help you to focus.

Second, perhaps more important than the physical location, is the need for a place with silence, where we can listen and focus by removing distractions. Silence is often viewed as something negative, that is "not talking" and doing things like turning off your cell phone. Yet silence has nothing to do with being alone in the negative sense. Silence is the precursor to communion with God. St. Bernard of Clairvaux said "Silence is the kiss of the Holy Spirit." Let Him come that close. Silence helps my prayer to go deeper, so it don't remain superficial. Thus silence is more than "no talking" - indeed quite the opposite; silence as a positive means choosing to talk with God.

Third, we have to create the time to pray. Too often, our schedules are so busy and so loud, with a constant bombardment of noise and activity. We need to make times in our schedules for prayer. If I wait until I have extra free time to pray, it doesn't happen. Prayer must be a resolute decision that this is a priority, to intentionally set aside the time. Perhaps set a reminder on your phone, or simply make a resolute like: "No bible, no breakfast" - I can't eat unless I've prayed first. And when thoughts of the hundreds of unfinished projects and other things you could be doing come, stay resolute. Be convinced & say: 'there is nothing more important I could be doing right now, no better way I could spend my time.'

Finally, once you are in the place and time for prayer time, I suggest you find some preparatory steps, a plan to begin your prayer. Begin by taking a minute to recall that God is present, and the reason why you are spending this time: "Lord Jesus, I place myself in your presence, I desire to praise, reverence and serve you. I pray that all my thoughts and actions in this time will be done for you." I become aware of how God looks at me, how he's been waiting for me to come. By this act of being aware of God's presence and his loving gaze, I'm now more ready to enter into prayer and have already begun to recollect myself.

Sometimes it may also be helpful to have a particular intention for your time in prayer. This could be any intention such as offering this time for someone's conversion, someone who is suffering, or any other need. But also make a more spiritual intention, meaning we can ask the Lord for some gift or grace: what is the desire on my heart I want to ask him for? For example, "Lord, may this time in prayer help me to grow in sorrow for my sins," or "help me to be more aware of the needs of others," or "strengthen me with the courage to stand up for what is right," or simply "Lord, I desire to love you more."

Application: Prayer Exercise ... (by Father Gary Coulter, director, Our Lady of Good Counsel Retreat House)

If you have not already, create a prayer space in your home. Then plan when your next prayer time will be, the same as you'd make an appointment to meet with a friend - use your calendar or set a reminder on your phone if needed. (And as suggested last week, pick out in advance a Gospel passage, book, or reflection to aid your prayer.)

Use preparatory steps to enter prayer: 1. Put yourself in God's presence. 2. Ask for his help; pray "Come, Holy Spirit, Come." 3. Offer God this time & yourself: your intellect, will and heart. 4. Ask Him for what you long for & desire. 5. Offer this time for a loved one or another intention.

As needed, use a gospel passage or devotion as a springboard, a launching pad for your prayer. Read slowly and when a thought stands out or insight strikes you, stop and meditate. How does this apply to you? What is this saying to you? Don't rush to continue reading, if something beautiful speaks to you, stay with it and talk to Our Lord about it.

Some possible concluding steps to end your prayer: 1. make a resolution, 2. pray a memorized prayer, 3. journal about what the Lord spoke to you, 4. be grateful.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... “Mystagogy,” reflection on the Easter mysteries, is the chief task of these great fifty days, a “pentecost,” in other words, of grace and renewal. Every Sunday we have accounts of Resurrection appearances of the Lord, and sketches of the earliest efforts at being church. Lent is described as a journey to the font, and Easter may be described in similar terms, since at the very beginning an angel tells the apostles that the Risen Lord “has gone before you into Galilee.” Galilee, of course, was the place where Jesus did his finest work, his preaching, his healing, his gathering the lost and the marginalized to the table. At Easter, we hurry to catch up, putting our renewed baptismal promises to work in our own personal Galilees, our little worlds waiting for a word of grace, a healing, an act of pardon, an invitation to share a meal. The water often splashed on our Sunday assemblies in Eastertide reminds us: these are the golden, shining days of grace, days to nurture the heart, to speak to one another about things that really matter.

GOD’S PLAN ... Saint Peter speaks to us twice today. In the first reading, we hear an excerpt from his sermon on Pentecost; in the second, part of his first letter. Once a frightened, uneducated fisherman who often said just the wrong thing, now Peter is speaking what he knows to be true. Everything Jesus had said now makes sense. His death and rising were all part of God’s plan, and our faith and hope can be centered on God. Today’s Gospel tells the story of Jesus’ walk to Emmaus with two of the disciples. Frightened, sad, and confused, the two of them don’t recognize Jesus, who tells them what we heard Peter say above: All this had to happen as part of God’s plan. In the end, these disciples recognize Jesus as we are to recognize him – in the breaking of the bread. – Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.
