Catching up at Lincoln PP abortion clinic ...

Helpers Update – June 18, 2020 ... It seems that some people may have become a bit lazy with the covid-19 pandemic. As for me, I must plead the 5th Amendment. (In this new age of social communications, I realize that many literary forms, including popular idioms have gone out of use – or are forgotten entirely. So, for any of our very young Helpers who may be reading this, to plead the 5th means that one doesn't have to say anything that might incriminate him or her.) Oh, yes, and incriminate means to give or have the appearance of guilt.

I hope most of you Helpers will tolerate this bit of aging humor – it's really for us older folks. Well, that is, those of us who are approaching old age (whatever that is).

A Good Samaritan and some "saves" ... The very next day after the last Update (on Dec. 30), three Helpers were praying during late morning of the cold New Year's Eve when a Good Samaritan dropped off cups of hot chocolate. This happens every winter, and in each instance no one recognizes the Good Samaritan. It's always an otherwise anonymous man or woman who doesn't give his or her name. But they always have a thank-you for those standing in witness for life outside the abortion clinic.

This is a reminder that our peaceful, prayerful presence is noticed by the public. So, the Judeo-Christian witness we show of caring about the lives and souls of babies, clients and abortion clinic staff is important beyond those immediately involved.

A further confirmation of our noticeable public presence happened in January when a young woman in mid-morning drove through the PP lot from the North and stopped before pulling onto the street. She rolled down the window of her car and spoke to the sidewalk advocate standing by the driveway. "What you're doing is very good," she said. She said she had come to have an abortion a year ago and she saw the pill reversal sign when she was leaving. She changed her mind and today she has a beautiful baby. "Keep it up," she said, and drove off.

Sidewalk advocates have been able to talk to several PP clients. A couple have gone to the Lincoln Pregnancy Center instead of into the abortion clinic. Helpers have also observed three or four other probable "saves" when people have arrived at the clinic, sat in their cars for a long time, and then drove away without going in.

Advocates replace counselors ... In the past year, the sidewalk counseling portion of the Helpers of God's Precious Infants in Lincoln has undergone a change. Some of the counselors took training from <u>Sidewalk Advocates for Life (SAFL)</u>, and Lincoln Right to Life now sponsors this program. The sidewalk counselors up to this time had various amounts of training, through Lincoln Right to Life programs, Msgr. Philip Reilly's Helpers of God's Precious Infants, and other organized programs. Most of the "old hands" and several new people have taken the SAFL training. Cathy Turner is the group representative, and Lisa McInerney coordinates the scheduling for abortion Tuesdays.

The term "advocate" better describes what the traditional sidewalk counselors do anyway. Counseling is more often associated with professional psychological training. Whereas, women and men as "advocates" offer support and encouragement for women to have their babies and not have abortions. So, if you hear reference to an advocate

and not a sidewalk counselor, you'll know what it means.

The SAFL program also tries to pair each advocate with a prayer partner. The partner is someone who just agrees to be there at the same time as the advocate, but standing off a short distance. This ensures a second person always there with an advocate, and someone who is praying for lives and souls, and support of the advocate. Helpers parking spaces ended Feb. 28 ... Lincoln Right to Life had leased six parking spaces just west of Sonic Drive-in from The Lodge apartment complex. The Lodge management wouldn't renew the lease this year & it ended Feb. 28. Last summer, someone from the Lodge had removed the LRTL reserved parking signs without saying anything to LRTL. When LRTL pressed the lease with management company, the signs were replaced; but the company said it would not renew the lease.

The management company is located in Kansas City, but the parent company that owns it is a Lincoln-born and headquartered company. Two men who attended the University of Nebraska incorporated Perry Reid Properties in 2001. It is a development and management company. It has several firms under it in a multi-state area. One of those, in Kansas City, manages The Lodge.

LRTL acquires building – Women's Care Center planned Lincoln Right to Life completed arrangements to acquire the building it has been renting the past three years at 5630 S. 48th Street, across from the PP abortion clinic. A Small group put up the money to buy the

entire building complex. It will continue some rentals with businesses in the far end (East) of the building.

LRTL is moving from its present location in the front of the building to a space further East. That's to make room for a new Women's Care Center that will open a free pregnancy health clinic there. The WCC is a non-profit organization established in 1986 in Gary, Indiana. It now has 32 pregnancy health clinics in 11 states. The Lincoln center will make Nebraska the 12th state.

The Women's Care Center needed to raise nearly \$200,000 to remodel & equip the center. So far it has raised about half that amount. Donations are tax-deductible. To donate, go to the WCC site. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... Every rectory office has received a panicked phone call from a person who has been invited to serve as a godparent, or from someone newly engaged, who suddenly "needs to get confirmed." While the lack of confirmation is not an obstacle for marriage, it is for godparenting. Many are surprised that the Church seems to be looking for a kind of sacramental "seal" on one's baptism before the door opens fully to this ministry. Yet if you think about it, would you want someone to guide you to a place that he or she had not yet been? A godparent has to be someone who has "been there" and knows the way. Although signet rings and wax seals have passed from use, our society depends on "seals of approval" ranging from certificates of quality to the familiar safety seals on medicines and foods. While Eucharist is the "seal" of the sacrament of baptism, there is a sense in which one's Christian initiation is also incomplete without confirmation. Have you been confirmed? ENTHUSIASM AND GRAMMAR ... There is a good reason that the writings of St. Paul don't show up as examples in grammar textbooks. Today's reading is a case in point. It begins with one of those long Pauline run on sentences that leave lectors gasping for breath. So what? Take a closer look at how Paul's fervor for his subject matter derails the grammar. There is something admirable about being so caught up in his convictions that the words cannot come fast enough to express them, much less in an orderly fashion. Scripture scholars usually take this grammatical ineptness as a sign of a passage's early importance in the Christian community, something they were so ardent about that their language never got refined. What leaves us in this condition? Re-telling the plot line of an action movie or the play-by-play of a sporting event? When was the last time any of us was so excited by our faith in Christ that we were left grasping for words, stumbling over our own errors in speech? It may be bad grammar, but it is an excellent way to inspire others with the message of Christ! —Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.
