Looking Back and Moving Forward

The Parish Building Committee began meeting in September 2008. As part of the discussions involved in deciding to build a new church, for a few weeks, there was a discussion about the possibility of selling the approximately 10 acres of land referred to as "the Farm" immediately south of the approximately 10 acres of land on which the Hall, Rectory, and Church have been built. This rental property was purchased in 2001 by our parish. After much discussion, we were advised by the Diocesan Building Committee not to sell the rental property.

The Parish Building Committee met five times between September – November 2008. After interviewing three different architects, the Committee decided to ask C G Architects from North Platte to work with us in designing our new church building. Members of the Parish Building Committee went on a "road trip" Nov. 14-15 to see other churches throughout the diocese, to view different styles of architecture and get ideas.

In preparation for our 2nd Annual Marian Mass, Rosary, and Candlelight procession on Wed, Oct. 8, 2008, our parishioners were encouraged to do the 33 day preparation for a Consecration to Jesus through Mary.

On Sundays and Wednesdays during Lent 2009, our parishioners were invited to participate in **The Great Adventure**: **A Journey through the Bible.** In this study, Jeff Cavins explains the major Bible events in chronological order so anyone can grasp the overall story of the Bible.

In the March 29, 2009 Bulletin, Fr. Seiker wrote: "This past week, a crew from Paulsen, Inc (from the Cozad office) was here to repair the cracks in the blacktop on our parking lot. They put a hot tar sealer in the cracks. They did a nice job, but the best thing about the job is that they did it for FREE! So, if you are in need of concrete or gravel, you might remember Paulsen's. Also, thank you to Ed Rieker for making the contacts and arrangements with Paulsen's."

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton sponsored a 12 week study and video series called: Light Weigh where you learn how to be at peace with food. The study was during June - August. Another session was help in October -December 2009. A third session was held in February – April 2010.

Our Parish also participated in the year long celebration of the "Year for Priests (June 19, 2009 - June 19, 2010) called for by Pope Benedict XVI to encourage priests to strive for spiritual perfection so that their ministry might be more effective. The year was chosen because it is the 150th anniversary of the death of the Holy Curé d'Ars, John Mary Vianney. All Catholic Churches in the North Platte area are invited to celebrate with our area priests and religious at a "Priest Appreciation Dinner" on Friday, May 21st at 6:00pm. As St. John Vianney, Universal Patron of Priests said: "If we fully realized what a priest is, we would die of love."

Thanks to all those who came to help with the parish grounds clean-up and the clean-up day at the "Farm" in June 2009. It was warm work, but we got the job done, and it looks better. Thanks!

On Oct. 7, 2009, the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, parishioners were invited to make a Consecration of oneself to Jesus Christ, Wisdom incarnate, through the hands of Mary during the 2nd Annual Marian Mass, Rosary, and Candlelight Procession. In order to better understand and prepare for this consecration, there is a 33 day period of preparation for the consecration which began on September 4.

Fr. Seiker wrote in the September 6, 2009 Bulletin "The Parish Building Committee has met many times over the last eight months with Stephen Granger of C G Architects from North Platte & reviewed many different versions of possible floor plans for the new church. The Building Committee met with the Parish Council/Finance Committee to review the proposed plans two times. On Friday, Aug. 7, some members of the Parish Building Committee met with the Diocesan Building Committee in Lincoln. There was a Parish Meeting scheduled on Saturday, August 15 and another Parish Meeting on Sunday, September 13, 2009 for the entire parish. The meeting will last one hour. Stephen Granger, our architect, and members of the Parish Building Committee will be available to answer questions."

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... Although the hours of daylight are rapidly dwindling, many people would say that these October days bring the year's most splendid weather. Americans are riders and joggers, not strollers, and so the pleasures of the season are often lost on us. This is not the case with many Jewish people, who observe an ancient rule in walking to synagogue on the Sabbath. On city streets and suburban sidewalks in many cities, we may notice around sunset the nicely dressed families walking and chatting on Friday afternoon. After a short prayer at dusk, the families stroll home again for a relaxing and festive meal. They return to synagogue in the morning, and then spend an afternoon in family leisure until three stars appear in the night sky and Sabbath ends. Catholics, on the other hand, pile into the car and drive even a short distance to Mass; some even divide the family to participate at different hours. For Jews, the leisurely walk marks a dividing line between hectic life commitments and a day of abundant joy and enrichment. Before we became an automobile culture, Catholics embraced a similar pace, and in most places walked to church. These lovely days of fall invite us to tap into an old and life-giving tradition. If you live within a mile of your church, walk next week. If you must drive, park at a good distance and walk the rest of the way. Talk about your life, greet strangers, notice the crunch of leaves under your shoes.
