PRAYERS FOR THE DEAD ... "It is a holy & pious thought to pray for the dead." (2 Macc 12:45). One of the corporal works of mercy is to pray for the dead. Those persons whom we have loved during their life here on earth, we should still remember to pray for after they have died. The best prayer of all is the Mass. Envelopes are available at the Bulletin Board in the Narthex to request Masses to be offered for the repose of the soul of any of your loved ones. The usual Mass stipend is \$10.00. Simply write the name of the deceased person on the envelope and your name and enclose \$10.00. If you write a check, please make the check payable to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church and write "Mass Stipend" in the memo. The Mass intentions are listed in the Bulletin. Pray for the dead!

An **indulgence** is granted the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the dead. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls in purgatory. <u>This indulgence is a plenary</u> (full) one from Nov. 1 through Nov. 8 & can be gained on each one of these days. On other days of the year this indulgence is a partial one.

An **indulgence** is the remission of the temporal punishment due to sins that have already been forgiven. An indulgence can be gained by doing certain works of devotion, penance & charity, under conditions that the Church has set down. An indulgence is partial or plenary, as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin. An indulgence can be gained for oneself or for souls in punishment due to sin. (CCC 1471) The official list of works & prayers that have an indulgence attached to them, as well as the conditions that must be met, are contained in The Handbook of Indulgences.

Besides the exclusion of all attachment to sin, even venial sin, the requirements for gaining a plenary indulgence are the performance of the indulgenced work and fulfillment of three conditions: sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion, prayer for the pope's intentions. The three conditions may be carried out several days before or after the performance of the prescribed work. But it is more fitting that the communion & the prayer for the pope's intentions take place on the day the work is performed.

On <u>Friday</u>, <u>Nov. 1</u>, <u>at 1:15pm</u>, we will meet at the <u>North Platte</u> <u>Cemetery</u> (on West Rodeo Road). We will <u>meet at the Flag</u>, and walk around the Cemetery and <u>pray the Rosary for the repose of the souls</u> <u>of our relatives</u>, <u>friends</u>, <u>and parishioners</u>. Looking Back and Moving Forward

In October 2009, Bishop Bruskewitz gave permission for our Parish to enter into a contract with C G Architects to complete plans for the construction of a new Church. Bishop Bruskewitz also gave permission for our Parish to enter into a contract with CCS (Community Counseling Services from Chicago) to have them assist us with a capital campaign to raise money for the construction of our new church. The six week campaign (*Committing to the Faith*) was scheduled during November and early December 2009. We received pledges totaling \$891,116.34 which exceeded our \$750,000 goal. It is also important to note that during the six years (2003-2009) before the Committing to the Faith Campaign our parish invested over \$365,000 from donations toward our new church.

In early December 2009, volunteers from the Parish, constructed a very temporary display of the Stained Glass Windows of the Third Glorious Mystery in the Parish Hall, to let our parishioners see the beauty of the stained glass windows which depict the mysteries of the Rosary. This display of the Third Glorious Mystery was in the Parish Hall until July 2010, when Lambrecht Glass Studio from Omaha, picked up all of the stained glass windows to take them to Omaha to be reviewed and prepared for installation in the new church.

Our Parish celebrated Forty Hours Eucharistic Devotions in March 2010, as Fr. Matthew Habiger, OSB came to speak to us about his pro-life work & our Faith, especially focusing on the Catechism of the Catholic Church in order to strengthen good marriages & strong family life. During Lent 2010, our parishioners were invited to participate in reading & discussing the book <u>Rediscovering Catholicism</u> by Matthew Kelly. There were four or five groups of parishioners that met weekly to discuss the book.

In the Feb. 14, 2010 Bulletin, Fr. Seiker wrote: "The Parish Building Committee met this past week with Fr. Hottovy and Char Kriz (who are helping us with the interior design and decoration of the new church) and also with David Walters from Diversified Design Group (who is designing the sound system for the new church). Stephen Granger from C G Architects put the finishing touches on the construction documents and after they are printed, they will be sent to the contractors."

At a combined meeting of the Parish Council, Parish Building Committee, and Finance Committee on March 25, 2010 we opened the bids for our new church that we had received from contractors. We decided to accept the bid from Simon Contractors, and on April 23, 2010, we signed a contract with Simon Contractors in the amount of \$1,903,600. Simon Contractors began construction work in May 2010.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... Friday's Solemnity of All Saints and Saturday's Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed fit well at the beginning of November. The liturgical readings of this final month in the Church year are keyed to the end of time and the fulfillment of Jesus' saving acts. Nowhere is this more fully celebrated than in Mexico, where November 2 is the "Day of the Dead." Missionaries moved an ancient Aztec festival from midsummer to November, linking the festival to Christian themes. Today, it is a time for remembering the dead and celebrating the continuity of life, principally by festive picnics in cemeteries. There are special foods and games, and people socialize with other families and tell favorite stories about their dear ones. The sweetness of life is honored by sugary desserts and treats. Flowers, music, lights, and feasting assure that the day is not at all morbid. Traditionally, the day begins with Mass, a procession to the cemetery, and a morning feast. Most families have a special dinner with the pan de muerto, or "bread of the dead." A toy skeleton is baked into the loaf, and the one who bites into it is considered lucky indeed. The dead are not feared, but deeply loved, and this joyful family feast points both to age-old customs and Resurrection faith. — James Field, Copyright © J.S. Paluch Co.

RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD ... Today's readings invite us into prayer, into relationship with God. Because relationships feel more natural when we know one another well, Sirach encourages us to know God better. In his wisdom, Sirach tells us what God is like: fair, open-minded, compassionate, and attentive. "The Lord will not delay," he says. Knowing that God's help comes right on time, whenever we need it, calms our hearts and helps us trust the Lord. In his second Letter to Timothy, Saint Paul demonstrates his own trust in God. Despite the grueling struggles Saint Paul has faced because of his Christian faith, he praises the Lord for rescuing him time and again. Today's Gospel draws us close to Jesus too, revealing his special love for the poor and humble. As Jesus tells his parable about the prayer habits of a Pharisee and a tax collector, our hearts long to become as gentle as Christ's. — Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.
