Thanksgiving ... in 1½ weeks, we celebrate Thanksgiving. The word "Eucharist" means "Thanksgiving". Every time we are present at Mass, we are expressing our thanks to the Father for the gift of the Body, Blood, Soul, & Divinity of His Son Jesus in the Eucharist. So, every day that we are at Mass is Thanksgiving Day in a sense.

CONTEMPLATIVE SISTERS (Pink Sisters & Carmelite Sisters) COLLECTION ... For over forty-six years now, our Diocese has been blessed to have a Religious Community of Sisters who spend the greatest part of their day before the Blessed Sacrament in their Chapel, praying for us. This community is affectionately known as the Pink Sisters, since the color of their religious habit is pink! It has been a custom in our Diocese to express our thanks to the Pink Sisters by taking up a special collection on Thanksgiving Day for the Pink Sisters. In the last nineteen years, our Diocese has been blessed with another contemplative community of religious Sisters, the Carmelites, (Conventis near Valparaiso). Please help financially support these communities who spiritually support us with their prayers!

Looking Back and Moving Forward

In November the pictures of Our Lady of Guadalupe (which was in our Adoration Chapel for years was put in a new frame), and the Image of Divine Mercy (which was purchased from Misericordia Publishing House and the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, in Warsaw, Poland, & shipped to us) and put in a frame to match the frame

for the picture of Our Lady of Guadalupe. This Divine Mercy Image is a computer generated picture which is a copy of the original image in the mother house in Poland. It has been stretched on a wooden frame.

For our Parish Lenten study in 2011 and also in October-November 2011, we studied "A Biblical Walk Through the Mass (a 5 part video series by Edward Sri). It explored the biblical roots of the words and gestures we experience in Mass and explains their profound significance.

In May 2011, the Clavinova which was purchased in March 2000, started to not be able to "play back" any of the recorded songs. Thus we purchased a new Yahama CVP-503 from Hershbergers in McCook for \$4,999.00 and our cantors were given a quick training on the features of the new Clavinova. An informative session "The new translation of the Roman Missal & the Role of Music" was held October 22 at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church.

Two different evenings each week during February-April, we hosted a showing of the new Ten-Part Documentary Series by Rev. Robert Barron entitled CATHOLICISM. It was well attended, even by a non-Catholic couple who in the Fall joined the RCIA classes and became full members of the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil in 2013. Our Forty Hours Eucharistic Adoration was held March 4-6. Msgr. Raymond Hain, a retired priest living at Bonacum House, who has been involved in Catholic education throughout his years as a priest, was our speaker.

Our Parish hosted a potluck card party in the Parish Hall on the third Sunday of many months from Feb–Oct 2012. We also hosted a monthly potluck meal for Parents with Children many months from Aug–Dec 2012.

From April–July 2012, residents of the North Platte area were invited to donate toward the installation of a Catholic Radio station in North Platte. On Monday, July 16, 2012, KFJS, Spirit 90.1 FM went on the air. In June and July, our parishioners participated in the national Fortnight for Freedom (6/21 – 7/4), praying for the protection of Religious Liberty.

At the recommendation of the Parish Building Committee, in April we sold our old stations, which we used in the Parish Hall for 15 years, to Sacred Heart Church, Beaver Crossing for \$9,000.00. The money was used to help pay off our Loan. In June 2013, after being advertised for three years with an internet company dealing with Church items, the four stone holy water fonts that we used in the Parish Hall for 15 years, have were sold to a Catholic Church in Virginia for \$1,600.00. After the commission fees were deducted, we received \$1,280.00. The money will be used to help pay off our Loan.

We received a number of gifts of donations during 2012.

- In April 2012, we received donated an Iwatsu Adix-VS digital telephone system. Some parishioners volunteered time to pull wires through the buildings and Dan Eastburn donated his time to help with the installation.
- An anonymous donor has offered to hire some painters to paint the Parish Hall and the classrooms. These rooms haven't been painted for 16 years. The painters will be using some/most of the paint left over from the new Church. So the colors will tie in well with the new church.
- Florence Boltz donated her house and contents to our Parish.
 It was auctioned to the highest bidder at the end of June. Our net proceeds were around \$42,000.
- A Lincoln Parish donated about 50 old metal folding chairs to us. They will be especially useful during the Pumpkin Festival.
- In his will / estate, Bernard Grieser left St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church \$49,061.69, which was used to pay off our D.I.A.L. loan.
- In July 2014, Doris Muchlinski left St. Élizabeth Ann Seton Church \$30,000 in her will/estate. This has been used to help pay off our loan to the D.I.A.L.

In May, volunteers installed Creston landscaping blocks around the Geo-thermal vault and south of the Parish Hall, and did some of the finish landscaping around the three buildings, including installing river rock on the South side of the Parish Hall. In September the original T-12 fluorescent light bulbs and ballasts were removed from the Parish Hall light fixtures & replaced with new T-8 fluorescent light bulbs & ballasts at a cost of about \$3,000. In September–October the shingles were removed and new shingles were installed on the "Farm" rental house, Parish Hall, Rectory, and Storage Shed. These roofs were damaged by a hail storm on April 14, 2012. We received an insurance payment from Catholic Mutual that totally covered all of the expenses. In January 2013, a new light switch was installed in the Narthex to operate the four wall sconces in the Narthex separate from the "can" lights in the ceiling.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... We are faced with strong and disturbing readings today that hold a certain fascination, since they seem at first glance to be blueprints for future inevitable wars and hardship. A fundamentalist interpretation focuses on this aspect. Yet we hear them at our Sunday celebration of the Eucharist, which infuses them with hope and optimism. Rather than dreading the future, today's liturgy assures us that God is with us in all of life's inevitable trials, and that we have a role in shaping the outcome of human history. Occasionally, some Christians have attempted to decode these readings for an exact measure of the world's end, but they have thus far been disappointed. "Nothing lasts forever" is a lyric from a Broadway show. Stars fall from the sky, leaves wither and fall, mountains wash into the sea, human projects and governments totter and collapse with great regularity. Today's liturgy opposes this idea as incomplete, reminding us that Christ has made a permanent change in human history, and that life in him is life forever. Rather than inviting us to throw in the towel, today's liturgy strengthens us for acts of goodness and grace in our families, communities, and world. —James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

LIFE IS HARD, BUT HAVE NO FEAR ... Today's readings take a fearless look at reality and reach a conclusion that we all know: life is hard. The prophet Malachi preaches fire and brimstone, warning us that evildoers will perish in flames. Saint Paul offers his own warning to the Thessalonians: keep busy, but never become a busybody. He reminds Christians that the apostles themselves worked in "toil and drudgery" as a model for how we ought to contribute to our community. The Gospel returns to the apocalyptic tone of Malachi, describing the utter chaos of the end-times. We will know the end is near when violence, catastrophe, and hatred dominate the earth. But we must not fear! God's saving plan brings peace to our hearts. Malachi speaks of the sun's "healing rays," and Jesus himself promises to protect every hair on our heads. Copyright © J. S.
