CONTEMPLATIVE SISTERS (Pink Sisters

& Carmelite Sisters) COLLECTION ... For over forty-six years now, our Diocese has been blessed to have a Religious Community of Sisters who spend the greatest part of their day before the Blessed Sacrament in their Chapel, praying for us. This community is affectionately known as the Pink Sisters, since the color of their religious habit is pink! It has been a custom in our Diocese to express our thanks to the Pink Sisters by taking up a **special collection on Thanksgiving Day** for the Pink Sisters. In the last nineteen years, our Diocese has been blessed with another contemplative community of religious Sisters, the Carmelites, (Convent is near Valparaiso). Please help financially support these communities who spiritually support us with their prayers!

Looking Back and Moving Forward

On September 14, 2012, Bishop James Conley was appointed by our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI as the ninth Bishop of Lincoln. Bishop Conley was previously the Auxiliary Bishop of Denver. Bishop Conley was installed as our Bishop on November 20, 2012. Don & Maureen Hayden were selected to represent our Parish at the installation Mass.

On November, 11, 2012, our Knights of Columbus Council #12530 hosted our first monthly breakfast. Our Knights have continued to host this breakfast on the 2nd Sunday of every month (except for October).

On Wednesday, 11/28/12 workers from Lambrecht Glass Studio in Omaha (the same company that checked over and installed the rest of the stained glass windows in our new church), installed two stained glass windows in the Cry Room. The Guardian Angel Window came from the Pink Sisters Chapel in Austin, TX. It was originally located right beside the three Archangel Windows (which were installed in our Parish Hall in 1996). This window needed to be modified by adding a few inches to the width of the window and by adding an arch to the window, as well as adding the words of the "Prayer to the Guardian Angel". The angel is holding a scroll on which is written the word "Custos" which is Latin for "Guardian". This work was paid for by an anonymous donor.

Workers from Lambrecht Glass Studio designed and manufactured stained glass windows that depict the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary, and also smaller stained glass windows for the two confessionals and the two sacristies. The new Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary stained glass windows were installed in April 2014. "We extend thanks to our anonymous donor, to Fr. Hottovy and Char Kriz for their consultation, and the Mark, Kris, and Jenna Lambrecht for the design and manufacturing of the windows. They look great and match the existing windows very well. I encourage parishioners to pray any of the 20 mysteries of the Rosary in the Church during daylight hours as you walk from window to window!"

In November, 2015, stained glass windows were installed in the Confessionals and the Sacristy. The images in the windows are: West Confessional (*Priest side*): St. Joseph; (*Penitent side*): Blessed Virgin Mary; East Confessional (*Priest side*): St. Andrew (one of 12 Apostles); (*Penitent side*): St. Elizabeth Ann Seton; Priest Sacristy: Crib with three crowns (which was vent window for St. Gabriel Window in Parish Hall); Fish with Gall fluid dripping into vessel (which was vent window for St. Raphael Window in Parish Hall).

Many veteran parishioners prayed many Rosaries before St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish was established. During the planning and construction of our new Church we prayed often for the intercession of St. Joseph. Our tabernacle, some statues, church pews (originally used in the Parish Hall and later that same wood from those pews was used to make the cabinets in the Sacristy of the new Church), and many other items were purchased at a very inexpensive price from the old St. Andrew Catholic Church in Osceola. (Our parish Library is also referred to as St. Andrew's Library for similar reasons).

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... Today's solemnity, the final feast of the Church year, is a youngster as feasts go. In 1925, Pope Pius XI was distressed by global political upheaval and the de-Christianizing of society. That year was a "Holy Year," keyed to the sixteen hundredth anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, when the words "and of his kingdom there will be no end" were added to the Creed. The Pope explained that although most feasts had developed over many centuries, the Church sometimes provided a new feast to address new needs. He pointed to the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, showing Christ's love and compassion in a time when many people embraced a cold and gloomy spirituality. Originally on the last Sunday of October, in the late 1960s the solemnity of Christ the King was moved to the last Sunday of the year. Fresh from baptism's waters, we are anointed with chrism "as Christ was anointed priest, prophet, and king." This feast is a key to our identity. On this feast, we recognize Christ as a king who breaks the usual mold of kingship, and who shapes his kingdom with our hands, our words, our deeds of love and service.

OF KINGS AND KINGSHIP ... Americans have an uncomfortable relationship with kings. The American Revolution was fought for independence from King George, after all. Nonetheless, today every Catholic church around the world celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Today's feast invites us to look beyond our national loyalties and rejoice in our primary identity. We are children of God in Jesus, Christ the King. Our readings help us consider what it's like to belong to God's kingdom. The book of Samuel captures the deep longing of the Israelites for a king to shepherd them. Saint Paul reminds the Colossians that we belong to the kingdom of Christ, whose power he praises in a beautiful hymn. Finally, Luke's Gospel calls to mind the kind of king Jesus chooses to be − a suffering servant, a man for others. By sacrificing his life for us, Jesus throws open the gates of Paradise.
