**New Pew Missals available** ... beginning <u>THIS</u> Saturday/Sunday, new Pew Missals will be available in the Narthex of the Church. <u>Parishioners are asked to pick up a new</u> <u>Pew Missal</u> and to use it during Mass for the Scriptures, Prayers, and the Music. <u>After Mass, Please take the Pew Missal home</u> with you and BRING It Back each week! This is YOUR PEW MISSAL from now until NEXT YEAR, November 26, 2021. These New Pew Missals are for the entire Liturgical Year (from Nov. 28, 2020 – Nov. 26, 2021). Whenever you come to Mass, bring it with you. You might want to leave your Pew Missal in your vehicle. There will also be Pew Missals available for Visitors to use for Saturday/Sunday Mass. It might be appropriate to note that our cost last year fiscal year (July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020) for missalettes from JS Paluch (recently sold to GIA) was \$1,489.60. The cost for these Pew Missals (same number as missalettes) is \$1,112.50.

**CHRISTIAN PRAYER (CCC)** ... beginning with this Bulletin, we will no longer be using quotes from the J. S. Paluch Co. on the back page of the Bulletin. Instead, you are invited to deepen your knowledge and experience of prayer! The Catechism of the Catholic Church (abbreviated CCC) is arranged in Four Sections: <u>The Profession of Faith (the Creed)</u>; <u>The</u> <u>Celebration of the Christian Mystery (Sacraments)</u>; <u>Life in Christ</u> (Morality); <u>Christian Prayer</u>. Each week, we will include a paragraph or two from the 4<sup>th</sup> Section of the CCC on Christian Prayer. In addition to the text from the Catechism, the text of the footnotes will also be printed. You are encouraged to read the Catechism and then when you come to a footnote, to go down and read the footnote and integrate and/or synthesize the two together. Also pray about what you have read. Ask the Holy Spirit to deepen your relationship with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in prayer!

## Catechism of the Catholic Church (Second Edition) PART FOUR – CHRISTIAN PRAYER **SECTION ONE – PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE**

2558 "Great is the mystery of the faith!" The Church professes this mystery in the Apostles' Creed (Part One) and celebrates it in the sacramental liturgy (Part Two), so that the life of the faithful may be conformed to Christ in the Holy Spirit to the glory of God the Father (*Part Three*). This mystery, then, requires that the faithful believe in it, that they celebrate it, and that they live from it in a vital and personal relationship with the living and true God. This relationship is prayer.

For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy.<sup>1</sup>
