Now is the Time Update: NPCS Endowment-Trust is happy to announce that Phase One of campaign projects is officially complete, with plans in place to begin Phase Two in May 2021. The NOW is the Time Campaign launched in December 2019 with a goal just shy of \$2 million for a variety of projects, including addressing 65-year-old plumbing and restroom fixtures at St. Pat's High School. Other items on the campaign include locker rooms, relocating offices, flooring, lighting, renovations to the faculty lounge, roof repair at McDaid Elementary, and growth of the endowment for future needs of the school system. Endowment Director Wendy Dodson reports that \$1,122,083 has been received in pledges and gifts. Improvements made thus far have already made a tremendous impact on the school and students. During summer and fall 2020, renovations were completed on one set of restrooms at St. Pat's High School, flooring and lighting were replaced along in the main hallway of the school, the faculty lounge was renovated to add restrooms, the student Honor Pass room was renovated, and the roof was repaired at McDaid Elementary. Pledges and donations are still needed to reach the total campaign goal, and support at all levels is greatly appreciated.

#### Catechism of the Catholic Church (Second Edition) PART FOUR – CHRISTIAN PRAYER SECTION ONE – PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE **CHAPTER ONE – THE REVELATION OF PRAYER**

The Universal Call to Prayer

2566 Man is in search of God. In the act of creation, God calls every being from nothingness into existence. "Crowned with glory and honor," man is, after the angels, capable of acknowledging "how majestic is the name of the Lord in all the earth." Even after losing through his sin his likeness to God, man remains an image of his Creator, and retains the desire for the one who calls him into existence. All religions bear witness to men's essential search for God.<sup>2</sup>

- Ps. 8:5 Yet you have made him little less than a god, <u>crowned him with glory and honor</u>.
- Ps. 8:1 O Lord, our Lord, how awesome is your name through all the earth! I will sing of your majesty above the heavens Cf. Acts 17:27 ... that they would seek God, if perhaps they might feel around for Him and find Him, though He is not far from each one of us; ...

2567 God calls man first. Man may forget his Creator or hide far from his face; he may run after idols or accuse the deity of having abandoned him; yet the living and true God tirelessly calls each person to that mysterious encounter known as prayer. In prayer, the faithful God's initiative of love always comes first; our own first step is always a response. As God gradually reveals himself and reveals man to himself, prayer appears as a reciprocal call, a covenant drama. Through words and actions, this drama engages the heart. It unfolds throughout the whole history of salvation.

#### ARTICLE 1: IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

2568 In the Old Testament, the revelation of prayer comes between the fall and the restoration of man, that is, between God's sorrowful call to his first children: "Where are you? ... What is this that you have done?" and the response of God's only Son on coming into the world: "Lo, I have come to do your will, O God." Prayer is bound up with human history, for it is the relationship with God in historical events.

- Gen. 3:9 The Lord God then called to the man and asked him: Where are you?
- Gen. 3:13 The Lord God then asked the woman: What is this you have done? The woman answered, "The snake tricked me, so I ate it."
- Heb. 10:5-7 For this reason, when he came into the world, he said: "Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you prepared for me; holocausts and sin offerings you took no delight in. Then I said, 'As is written of me in the scroll, Behold, I come to do your will, O God."
