We have 2 veteran members & 2 new members on the parish council each year. Hopefully there will be 4 parishioners' names on the ballot.

The Christmas Season ... lasts from the Christmas Vigil Mass on Christmas Eve to the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on Jan. 12. It has been a custom of the Church to celebrate ADVENT during the Advent Season without any Christmas decorations, & to celebrate CHRISTMAS during the Christmas Season, by leaving the manger scene & trees up until the end of the Christmas Season (Jan 12). May we all walk the path of God, not the path of man! May each of you have a HOLY Christmas season and a Blessed New Year!

Christmas Thank You's ... to those who helped with decorating the Church, arranged the flowers, set up outdoor decorations, the Choirs, Cantors, Servers, Lectors, Acolytes, Ushers, & all who gave of themselves to the Lord to make the feast day of our Lord's birth a special day. Also thanks to all who gave cards, gifts, & Christmas goodies to me, and especially for your prayers. Your kindness is appreciated!

Looking Back and Moving Forward

Because of a failure of the septic system at the "Farm" rental house, we asked the City of North Platte to include the "Farm" rental property in the city limits, and also to install a

main sewer line on the East side of Echo Drive going South toward the "Farm" rental house. Because of the elevation of the land, our parish had to install a "diagonal pipe" to connect the rental house with the city main sewer line. It was projected that this might cost us as much as \$46,000. Since the Parish Hall, Rectory, and Church are already connect to the city sewer, we had a "grandfather clause" and thus there was "frontage cost" to our parish for the installation of the main sewer line on the East side of Echo Drive. The total cost of the "Farm" Sewer Improvement Project ended up being only \$23,386.30. This work was done in August and September.

On Tuesday, September 12, 2017, Sean Forrest spoke in our Parish Hall to adults and children in Grades 7-12. His talk was: "What's the Difference Between Catholic and Protestant?" All Christian religions are not the same. He talked about how his conversion from Protestantism to the Catholic Church has changed his life.

During October-November, parishioners joined in a Study by Dr. Christopher Blum (from the Augustine Institute) in the Parish Hall called: "True Reformers: Saints of the Catholic Reformation". It was a great opportunity to better understand what happened 500 years ago and apply it to our own times.

In January 2018, some women in our parish joined the Seven Sisters Apostolate, which is a call to strengthen the Church by ensuring that a Holy Hour is prayed each day of the week for the sole intention of a specific priest or bishop.

Fr. Michael Zimmer spoke at our annual Forty Hours Eucharistic Adoration March 11 - 13, 2018. His talks were: Behold the Lamb of God; Discipleship and the Lamb of God; and Go Forth with the Lamb of God. Our parishioners were also encouraged to participate in the Parish Mission at St. Patrick Catholic Church in North Platte themed "I Am The Bread of Life." Father James Costigan of the Fathers of Mercy presented talks on five nights.

In May 2018, parishioners joined a Study by the Augustine Institute Studios called: Presence: The Mystery of the Eucharist. It was a very good presentation on the Mystery of the Eucharist. There were good discussions.

On Sunday, September 9, 2018 Curtis Tomasevicz spoke in our Parish Hall to adults and children in Grades 7-12. He is currently a teacher at UNL, a former 2010 Olympic Bobsled Gold Medal winner, & a Catholic. He reflected on the spiritual component of overcoming fear & trusting in God's providence.

On Wednesday, November 28, 2018, at the suggestion of a few parishioners, we began having Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on MOST *(there may be some rare exceptions due to schedule conflicts)* Wednesdays throughout the year from 6:00pm *(after 5:30pm Mass)* until 10:00pm. Anyone is invited to just "drop in" to spend some time with our Eucharistic Lord ... but we need 4 persons each week.

Women in our parish were invited to join other Catholic women in North Platte at the Spiritual Life Center at St. Patrick Church on Sunday, December 2 for a program entitled: Women at the Well to journey through Advent and gain spiritual fruits, particularly peace and joy.

In January 2019, a committee of men & women from our Parish was formed to begin planning our 25th Anniversary as a Parish *(founded by Bishop Bruskewitz on June 13, 1994)*. This committee has been very helpful in working together and planning for our 25th Anniversary as a Parish.

In March-April 2019, parishioners joined a Study by the Dr. Edward Sri called: No Greater Love: A Biblical Walk Through Christ's Passion. It was a very good presentation on the Christ's Passion and His love for us.

Dr. Michael Barber spoke at our annual Forty Hours Eucharistic Adoration March 31 – April 2, 2019. His talks were: "Are You Saved? Salvation in Catholic Teaching"; "By Grace You Have Been Saved"; Grace, the Sacraments, our Dependence on God's Mercy; "Work Out Your Salvation": Salvation as Sharing in Christ's Redemptive Work.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION ... Life hands us many epiphanies or “wake up calls.” A few years ago, a young couple adopted a two-year-old child in a morass of red tape, complications, and court hearings. At the baby’s baptism, the priest suggested appending an “adoption blessing,” wherein the new relationship was expressed and affirmed. There is a place in that rite for the child to speak, and instead the priest said, “Can you give Daddy a kiss?” Standing in the midst of his church, the young adoptive father suddenly welled up with tears as he embraced the child. Afterward, he explained that through all the hassles and legal struggles he never until that moment in church understood that he was the parent of this child. The ritual claimed them for each other, gave expression to their relationship that the legal documents never could, and firmly cemented this child into the heart of a community as everyone erupted into heartfelt applause. This assembly witnessed in a powerful way what happens in every baptism: the mystery of adoption, the free flow of grace, the overwhelming sense of God’s presence at the heart of our life’s journey. —Rev.
