Starting January 1, 2025, all clergy, religious, lay employees, and volunteers in the Diocese of Lincoln are required to complete and/or renew safe environment training in the month of January. This will require a new background check if there is no current one on file or if a previous one has expired. This training does not change the policy on background checks, which requires a background check be completed every five (5) years. Anyone whose duties, ministries or organizations that include any contact with minors are required to complete safe environment training (e.g. CCD teachers and aides, acolytes, lectors, readers, youth choir director or organizations such as Altar Society or Knights of Columbus where children may help). All clergy and religious, regardless of assignment or ministry, are required to complete safe environment training. in January 2025. Thereafter, all clergy, religious, employees, and volunteers (in contact with youth) will renew training every January. Preparing for the Mass--Days Ahead Read the Mass Readings from the USCCB; Look for what ties the readings together, there is usually a common thread.; Listen for what God is trying to tell you ... this is His word speaking to you directly. The Day of Mass Arrive early and sit close to the front – it helps both children and adults stay focused. Call on the Holy Spirit to open your heart, mind, and soul to God. Bring a journal and listen for key scriptures or thoughts from the homily that speak to you. Jot them down to meditate on over the coming week. If you do get distracted, acknowledge it, and focus your attention back on the Mass. The Time Before Mass Pray Prayers Before and After Mass Read the Collect or opening prayer of the Sunday in the missallette. Prepare your intentions for the Mass - What do I want to pray for when the Priest invites us to pray? Time before Mass if offered can include joining in the recitation of the rosary asking our Blessed Mother to intercede for your intentions.
