<u>A stylish lady who</u> thought much of herself stops to admire a parrot at a pet store. The parrot crudely says to her, "Hey lady, you are really ugly." Well, the lady is furious! She storms past the store to her meeting. The next day she sees the same parrot in the window. When the parrot sees her it says, "Hey lady, you are still ugly." She's livid, and storms off. A day later she sees the same parrot and once again it says, "Hey lady, you really are ugly." The lady is so furious that she marches into the store and threatens to sue the store and have the bird killed. The store manager apologizes profusely and promises the bird won't say it again. The next day when the lady walks past the store to enjoy her triumph the parrot says to her, "Hey Lady!" She pauses, scowls with an icy stare, and says, "Yes?" And the parrot says, "... I think You know ... "

Fatherhood has its origins in God, who chose to reveal Himself to us as Our Father, sending His only Son for the sake of our salvation. Fathers therefore have a special role "in revealing and in reliving on earth the very fatherhood of God". Fathers are called to exhibit "generous responsibility for the life conceived under the heart of the mother". They are uniquely entrusted with the protection and defense of both mother and child and, in this way, in safeguarding the sanctity of human life. As evidenced in our world today, the role of the father "is of unique and irreplaceable importance". Often women choose abortion because they do not have the support of the child's father, or—even worse—the father of the child pressures her to make the decision to abort. At the same time, it is important to acknowledge with compassion that men can also be overwhelmed by an unexpected pregnancy and that society increasingly tells them that they should have no say in their children's lives. In the face of these false messages, pray that fathers of preborn children will find courage in the example of Saint Joseph—who embraced the role of father amid difficult circumstances—and offer loving, life-affirming support to the mothers of their children.

Since Candlemas/Presentation falls on a First Friday in February, with Adoration immediately following, anyone who wishes to bring in candles to be blessed and used in their homes are to bring them and put them in front of the altar before Mass on Thursday, February 1. After Mass, they may be taken home. If you cannot be present, please arrange with someone to act in your stead.

<u>The Blessing of St. Blaise</u> will be given after Masses (8 am and 5:00 pm), only on his feast Day, Saturday, February 3.

<u>Anointing of the Sick</u> will be given immediately after the morning Mass on Tuesday, February 6. Any Catholic who is able to receive communion and is suffering from a life-threatening illness or disease, will have an upcoming surgery, or is over the age of 65, is welcome to receive the Sacrament. If you have any questions about whether you can or should receive the sacrament, speak to Fr. Rand.

Be Prepared Ash Wednesday is February 14!

For those wishing to incorporate a weekly Mass, Stations of the Cross, or Adoration into their Lenten plans, the tentative schedule for Wednesdays of Lent (Feb 21-all of March) will be Stations at 5:30 pm, Mass at 6:00 pm, followed by Adoration until 9 pm. In addition, one could use these means also to gain a plenary indulgence by adoring the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament during Adoration for at least a half-hour, praying with the Parish the Stations of the Cross, or reading sacred scripture with devotion for at least a half-hour. However, we must remember there are some stipulations provided which must be met in order for the indulgences to be plenary. If all the conditions are not met, we receive partial indulgences, but not plenary indulgences. Conditions to be met: 1.) Sacramentally confess your sins in Confession within 20 days before or after the indulgent act. (one sacramental Confession is sufficient for several indulgences) 2.) Be in a state of grace (which you receive from Confession) and have a complete detachment from sin. This does not mean that you are to be sinless, but you are to have a detachment from sin. 3.) Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father. You can do this by simply reciting the Our Father and one Hail Mary for the intentions of the Holy Father. 4.) Reception of Holy Communion (must receive Holy Communion for each plenary indulgence sought) It is permissible that Holy Communion may be received several days before or after obtaining the indulgence, but it is preferable it is received the same day of the indulgent act. 5.) One must have a general intention of gaining an indulgence beforehand.

Lenten Growth: Letting the Holy Spirit speak to our hearts and minds during this Lenten liturgical season is not only a preparation for the celebration of Easter and its season but can sift out and give clarity to our relationship with Christ and our walk with Christ. Keeping a journal of our thoughts can often reveal the movement of the Holy Spirit in our lives and give direction and guidance that we seek. Our days can be filled with distractions, routines, difficulties, and confusion. If you would like to join this personal engagement via a communal setting, then perhaps this Lenten series is for you. Each week you will be given journal prompts to write a

response in your journal. You can answer as many as you wish but should give sufficient time for reflection on your responses. Each week, we will gather, and if not too personal, share what The Spirit moved us to respond. Listening to another's encounters is also a means for the Spirit to help us on our journey. New journal prompts will be given weekly. Rereading after Easter what has been written may provide valuable insights into oneself and areas of growth and can help us grow in our relationship with God. We will meet on Tuesday mornings over a cup of coffee from 9am-10am on February 20, 27 and March 5, 12, 19, and 26 in the Parish Hall. Bring your own journal or notebook. Please let Fr. Rand know if you want to participate in order to receive the first meeting's questions in advance.
