All Souls' Day (Nov. 2) provides the opportunity to gain indulgences for our departed loved ones and for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory. What is an indulgence? "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven (in the Sacrament of Confession), which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1471). From the *Handbook of Indulgences*: A plenary (full) indulgence, which is applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a church or an oratory on All Souls' Day. The requirements for obtaining a Plenary Indulgence are:

- Visit a church and pray for the souls in Purgatory while in the state of grace
- Say the Our Father and the Creed during the visit to the church (this is accomplished in the liturgy if your visit is during Mass; outside of Mass, offer these on your own)
- Pray for the Pope's intentions (an Our Father, or Hail Mary, or any other appropriate prayer is sufficient)
- Worthily receive Holy Communion (on the day itself or soon thereafter)
- Make a sacramental confession within 20 days of All Souls' Day, either before or after
- For a plenary indulgence, be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin (otherwise, the indulgence is partial, not plenary). It is sufficient that the Christian makes an act of the will to love God above all things and to despise all sin.

In addition, you can gain a plenary indulgence visiting a cemetery each day between 1 November and 8 November. These indulgences are applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory. A partial indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, can be obtained whenever saying the "Eternal rest" prayer: "Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen."

Bishop's Appeal for Vocations Pledge cards have been mailed out. The Bishop's Appeal for Vocations organizes an annual appeal collection, which supplies some of the cost of the expenses for our seminarians, our future priests, in their studies, training, and formation for the priest hood. • The annual Bishop's Appeal for Vocations is an integral part for the future of our diocese, and every person is invited to participate in the future of the Church by helping form our future priests. • The 2023-24 vocations expenses were \$1.2 million. Funds for the formation of our seminarians are provided through the annual Bishop's Appeal for Vocations, endowments and burses (managed through the Catholic Foundation of Southern Nebraska), and tuition payments from the seminarians. The 2023 Bishop's Appeal for vocations had a goal of \$800,000 and thankfully surpassed that goal by \$400,000 to raise \$1.2 million, the full amount needed. For 2024-25 our need has grown to about \$1.7 million as the number of seminarians studying for the Diocese of Lincoln has grown from 25 to 34! Amen It is difficult to see how some Christians can criticize the private prayer life of other Christians. One such criticism centers on the element of repetition of the prayer, "Hail Mary." But to even the casual reader of the word of God it must be apparent that the writers of the Bible--and God Himself--used the repetition of words and expressions in prayer. The Bible uses repetition to indicate emphasis and the highest degree of something. Is 6:3 "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of Hosts!" they (the Seraphim) cried one to another. The Psalms are a good example of repetition in prayer. Psalm 150 records a twelve-fold repetition in one psalm. –taken from catholicapologetics.org
