North Platte St Patrick's will host the Eucharistic Miracle Boards from Catholic Spirit Radio on October 13-18, 2023. The first recorded miracle was in Lanciono, Italy in 1700. There have been more than 150 miracles approved by the Vatican. Eucharistic Miracles consist of unexplainable phenomena occurring after transubstantiation, such as a host visibly transforming into human tissue, a host surviving fire, a host bleeding or the Eucharist alone providing sustenance to a human being for a prolonged period of time. In order to be considered a Eucharistic miracle, the event is investigated by a special task force before deciding it is worthy of belief. Secular sources are often used to investigate and confirm the miracle. Make time to take up this opportunity!
