- 1. Select an organization to Attribute a gift on behalf of from the drop down menu.
- 2. Enter a Gift amount. It can be an amount other than the suggested amount.

- 3. Select a Gift frequency.
- 4. Enter the desired Date for the Gift.
- 5. Click on the Continue button
- 6. Enter an Email address.
- 7. Enter a First name.
- 8. Enter a Last name.
- 9. Enter a Phone number. This is optional.
- 10. Select Payment Type: Bank or Credit Card.
- 11. Enter Payment Type information.

For a Credit Card, ensure the name that is auto populated matches the name on the card and enter the rest of the payment information. (Card number, CVV, expiration month and year.)

For Banking Information, enter whether it is checking or savings, the routing number and account number.

- 12. If desired, check the box to donate up to an extra 5% to Offset Processing Fees.
- 13. Enter Payment Method Address. (This is not the payment method institution address. For example, it may be the address where the statement is mailed.)
- 14. Select whether to give a gift as a guest or to create an account.
- 15. If creating an account, create a password.
- 16. Click on Submit your Gift to populate a confirmation of Thanks. The Donor receives a confirmation email which includes the Gift information. The Gift is processed!

Note* A returning Donor is prompted to sign in if they enter a recognized email while filling out the Your Information form.

"St. Lucy's Lights" on view this month: Before science was able to disprove their theories, early Catholics believed that meteors were sent by God. The Perseids meteor showers which occur annually in August, were thought by Catholics to be the fiery tears of the martyred St. Lawrence; the Geminid Meteor Showers which occur around mid-December, is sometimes called St. Lucy's Lights in honor of the "Saint of Light" virgin and martyr whose feast falls on December 13. This year an average of 75 multicolored meteors are expected. The showers peak on the morning of December 14, although some meteors should be visible from December 14-24. Best viewing is usually to the east after midnight.
