Feast of the Epiphany – January 6th, The Epiphany blessing is a simple blessing written on the main entrance door of your home as follows: The first two digits of the year + C + M + B + the last two digits of the New Year. So this year, it would look like this for English speakers: 20 + C + M + B + 23. The meaning behind the letters C + M + B There are traditionally two meanings behind the letters C, B, and M The initials of the wise men: Caspar, Balthazar, and Melchior The first letters in the Latin Phrase: Christus Mansionem Benedicat (meaning May Christ Bless this House). What do I need to bless my home? Holy Water , Chalk, A Door, The Actual Blessing of your home Make the sign of the cross and sprinkle some holy water on the door. Then, recite a simple prayer like the following or similar: “Loving God, bless this household and all who enter. May all who pass through this door be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, and a desire to do your will. We ask this through Christ Jesus, our only Savior and King. Amen” You can find more extended Epiphany Blessings online if you wish. If you have more than one person in your home, each person can take a turn writing the letters over the door and blessing the home. This might be a beautiful way to have your entire family involved in the blessing and can be a wonderful reminder that your family reflects the presence of Christ's love all year round!

For tax purposes, anyone wishing to show on their 2022 contribution statement amounts given will need to have made the donations before December, 31, 2022. Statements will be processed mid-January for distribution.

Beginning January 2, 2023 we will incorporate a short parish prayer at the end of all Masses. This prayer includes, in part, the St. Michael Prayer after Mass.
