5 Steps To Prepare Yourself for a Holy Advent:

1. Ask God to help you draw near to Him. The more we yearn for Christ in Advent, the closer we come to a real celebration of Christmas 2. Begin to practice silence. Don't let the noise of the world distract from listening in prayer 3. Gather your essential Advent items. Allow the full meaning of Advent to enter with Advent candles in the home, works of mercy and letter writing to those who need encouragement or combatting loneliness or grief 4. Don't sweat the small stuff. Allow patience, priorities and purpose to overcome obstacles, worries or stresses 5. Prepare for a good confession now. Give Christ the gift he yearns for—a cleared conscience and peace with God, neighbor and self!

Relationships descriptions in terms of a Parish or church: A. Those who treat the local church like a store. These types of people are always shopping for the best deal for themselves. These folks are highly uncommitted. They base their presence on the music, the preaching, the social climate, the entertainment value, the ability to be unknown or unseen in the crowd. When things don't suit them, they go elsewhere to shop. B. Those who treat the local church like their favorite restaurant. This type of people has fooled themselves into thinking that they are faithful and loyal to their local church because they only/exclusively attend just one local church, but they are rarely seen and, because of their lack of attendance, don't give of their time, talents, and treasure with ease. They reserve a place for special events, celebrations or occasions just as you would in giving your presence to your favorite restaurant. C. Those who treat the local church like their local gym. They have plunged themselves into making their lives spiritually healthy and their neighbors' lives better. They hardly miss a Sunday without good reason out of faithfulness to give of themselves. They continue to work out on their own nearly every day (i.e., praying, doing works of mercy, spiritual reading, sharing their faith) and

then on Sunday, they converge at their local church to work out by lifting some serious weight as they love, give, forgive, share, and serve. They go to receive Christ and to impart and strengthen Christian witness to their spiritual family, even as they seek to strengthen their own families or selves, and carry Christ to the waiting world.
