Each morning Pope John Paul II celebrated Mass in his private chapel with about twenty guests. When he knelt down to pray after Communion, he would close his eyes and go to a place deep within himself. Once he was there nothing and no one could distract him from communing with God. What does it mean to commune with God? To share your intimate thoughts and feelings. Pope John Paul II would go to that place deep within himself, and from that place he brought forth the fruit of his life: wisdom, compassion, generosity, understanding, patience, courage, insight, forgiveness, humility, inspiration, and a love so apparent you could almost touch it. In those moments after Communion, he allowed nothing to distract him from his prayer. And he lived his life from that place. Find that place within you. Find that place deep, deep within yourself, the place where you can connect with God. Ways to Cultivate Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus Pope Francis emphasizes that devotion to the Sacred Heart is not merely about venerating an image or reciting prayers—it is about allowing our hearts to be transformed by the love of Jesus. Here are some practical ways to live out this devotion: 1. Daily Prayer and Consecration: One of the simplest and most profound ways to deepen our devotion is by dedicating our day to the Sacred Heart of Jesus through prayer. Pope Francis suggests using traditional prayers, such as the Act of Consecration to the Sacred Heart, or composing a personal prayer expressing our desire to love and serve as Jesus does. Morning consecration aligns our intentions with the Heart of Jesus, while evening prayer offers an opportunity for reflection and gratitude. 2. First Fridays Devotion: Revitalizing the practice of observing the First Fridays is another way to grow closer to the Sacred Heart. This devotion, based on Jesus' revelations to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, involves receiving Holy Communion on nine consecutive first Fridays of the month in reparation for sins. Pope Francis calls this practice "a school of love," teaching us to unite our hearts with the heart of Jesus in humility and penance. 3. Eucharistic Adoration: The Sacred Heart is closely tied to the

Eucharist, as it is in the Eucharist that the love of Jesus is most fully revealed. Spending time in Eucharistic Adoration allows us to gaze upon the Heart of Jesus and be filled with his love. Pope Francis encourages all believers to make Adoration a regular part of their spiritual lives, describing it as "a meeting of two hearts—the Heart of Jesus and our own." 4. Living the Beatitudes: Pope Francis writes in DilexitNos that the Sacred Heart calls us to "embody the Beatitudes as a way of life." The Beatitudes reflect the values of the heart of Jesus: humility, mercy, purity, and peace. By striving to live according to these principles, we make the love of the Sacred Heart visible in the world. 5. Acts of Charity and Service: The Sacred Heart devotion inspires us to put our faith into action through acts of kindness, generosity, and ser vice. Pope Francis reminds us that "true devotion always leads to mission." He challenges us to reach out to the marginalized, care for the poor, and promote justice and peace as tangible expressions of our love for Jesus. 6. Family and Community Devotions: Pope Francis encourages families and parish communities to gather in prayer and devotion to the Sacred Heart. Enthronement of the Sacred Heart in homes is a tradition that acknowledges Christ as the center of family life. Group prayer, reflection, and acts of charity within the parish also foster a commitment to living out the love of the Sacred Heart.
