What is a Priest's Convocation? Convocations are a "calling together of a group of people," Bishop Conley is "calling together" all the priests of the Diocese of Lincoln. What is the purpose of the Convocation? The purpose is three-fold, and is summed up well in the theme of the convocation, "Flourishing as Priests: Body, Mind, and Soul." This convocation will offer a daily talk to the priests on the theme of wellness and health: physical, spiritual, and social. In addition to the talk each day, the priests will be given TIME: for socializing with their brother priests, for recreation, to relax, to pray, and to get caught up on sleep. Workload and distance often prevent many of our priests from experiencing these things on a routine basis. For the days of the Priest's Convocation May 27-30, the Diocese will set up ONE emergency number, to be used only from Monday at 12:00pm until Thursday at 3:00pm of that week. When the call is received, the message will be directed to the nearest priest to respond to the emergency. Remember that the number will only be in operation during the days of the convocation. The emergency number for the days of the convocation will be 402-915-1206.

The Annual Field Mass, in remembrance of the first Mass held in this area by the Spanish Conquistadors, will be Sunday, June 16 at 8:00am. Directions: Turn right onto East Halligan Drive. Follow East Halligan Dr. until the North Platte

Community College. After passing the college buildings, there will be a large grassy field on the north side of the road. Turn north onto the lane leading towards the trees. There will be someone to show you where to park.

Anyone who participates in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage or attends the 10th National Eucharistic Congress will be granted a plenary indulgence--this special remittance of temporal punishment associated with confessed sins (under the usual conditions of an indulgence). That means every stop along the nationwide Pilgrimage route (AND THAT INCLUDES NORTH PLATTE) and the Congress event itself are now even greater opportunities for grace than they were before! As we move closer more information will be made for the Revival stop in North Platte—but events to mark on your calendar now include a Holy Hour Friday June 14 at St Elizabeth Ann Seton Church beginning at 6:30 pm; Saturday, June 15 morning Mass at 8:00 am at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and special Mass on Sunday June 16 at McDaid School at 11 am with Bishops Hannefeldt and Conley ending with a Corpus Christi procession to St Patrick's parking lot. The Parishes on North Platte this year will not have individual Corpus Christi processions in favor of the national one on June 16 and St Patrick's and Holy Spirit will not have their regular 11 am Masses in favor of the special Mass. St. Elizabeth Ann Seton will have the Field Mass at 8 am and its normal 10 am Mass for the sake of NebraskaLand day visitors and those who would prefer a Parish setting.

The Diocese of Lincoln Priest Convocation,

called by Bishop Conley, will be held in Kearney, NE for all Lincoln Diocesan priests on the evening of May 27—Thursday, May 30th. Nine priests will be assigned to cover emergencies throughout the Diocese during that time. Fr. Rand has been assigned to cover the western three deaneries those dates and relocate temporarily to McCook to have better access to the hospitals of Cambridge, Benkleman and McCook.

The Catholic doctrine of the Real Presence is the belief that Jesus Christ is literally, not symbolically, present in the Holy Eucharist—body, blood, soul and divinity. Catholics believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist because Jesus tells us this is true in the Bible:"I am the bread of life. Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. This is the bread which comes down from heaven, that a man may eat of it and not die. I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live for ever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh. The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you; he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day. For my flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him" (John 6:48-56). Furthermore, the early Church Fathers either imply or directly state that the bread and wine offered in the celebration of the Lord's Supper is really the body and blood of Jesus Christ. In other words, the doctrine of the Real Presence that Catholics believe today was believed by the earliest Christians 2,000 years ago!—Catholics Come Home.
