The method of Lectio Divina allows one to prepare for Mass, reflect on it afterwards, or infuse one's prayer life, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to allow God to speak to one's heart and mind directly. One prepares for the voice of the Holy Spirit spoken to us through a spiritual text. One renews his desire to meet God by quieting the soul and focusing on the work God has placed in our hands: the meditation and contemplation of His Word. Select only a few verses, a short passage, from Sacred Scripture and begin. Steps: I. Lectio (attentive reading [aloud], perusal) One slowly (with calmness; not hurried) reads the text, giving pause where the Spirit moves and allowing the weight of the passage to be comprehended. The Lectio, consists of reading and rereading (2-3 times) a passage from Sacred Scripture and taking in the main elements. One may read aloud (or at a whisper to avoid disturbing others) to engage your sense of speech and hearing. Taste and savor the words. II. Meditatio (meditation – encounter the passage with your senses) One reflects on the meaning of the passage, and allows the Holy Spirit to guide him to the word or phrase that God is calling him to consider. Be attentive to see if one word stands out. This is a moment of interior reflection in which the soul turns to God and tries to understand what His word is saying today. This is patient analysis; listening to the inner echo until it permeates every fiber of our heart; savoring in the heart; rumination. Smell and taste the dust, hear noises, see colors from the passage. III. Oratio (speech, conversation, prayer) One now speaks to God about the meaning

of that word or phrase in everyday life. We linger to talk with God directly. This is a free outpouring of the soul in silence. IV. Contemplatio (contemplation – rest in the Lord) One now rests wordlessly while he listens to God's voice. Through simple and pure contemplation, one hears God's response. This helps us to keep our hearts and minds fruitful.

School choice opponents are currently attempting to repeal the Opportunity Scholarships Act, LB753, and have fled a petition with the Secretary of State to engage in a ballot referendum process. If they collect enough signatures, LB753 will be subject to a vote of the people in November 2024. In response, the "Keep Kids First" campaign has been launched. The effort, backed by all three Nebraska Bishops, aims to educate Nebraskans about the truth of school choice and urge them to "Decline to Sign" the opponents' petition.
