SEAS Teaching Rock: When St. Elizabeth Ann Seton first began teaching, she taught faith formation classes to children in the nearby parish on Catoctin Mountain in Maryland, but she did not have a schoolhouse to hold her classes. Instead, Mother Seton taught children about the Catholic faith from a rock in the woods on Sunday afternoons. This rock still exists and is memorialized with a plaque. It lies directly behind Mount Saint Mary's University and Seminary. While this physical rock of Mother Seton must remain in place, the spiritual rock of the Church continues to take up the task of informing, instructing and teaching the Catholic faith. With that in mind and in union with our parish patroness, SEAS Teaching Rock invites any and all (from any parish and those not fully united in our faith) to formation topics of interest to deepen their knowledge of the Catholic faith. SEAS Teaching Rock will meet at 6:30pm on Wednesdays throughout the year, with the first four dates being August 10, September 14, October 12, and November 9. The August meeting will focus on Fr. Rand's conversion story and call to the priesthood, and September on "Through the Eyes of Satan." In conjunction with each meeting, there will be light refreshments or snacks. How does a priest know which Mass to celebrate on a particular day? When the Mass is not prescribed such as a Sunday, Holy Day or something similar, a priest can choose from several options. Some may be for a particular saint, votive, or ritual. A hint can many times be found in understanding the meaning of the colors presented by chalice veils on the altar. For instance, red indicates typically a martyr or a connection to the Holy Spirit, green indicates ordinary time or white a non-martyred saint, the Blessed Mother, a votive and so forth. Companies that print Mass readings such as the Magnificat or Word Among us do not always present all the options available to a priest, and so sometimes the antiphons, responsorial, or readings may not correspond to what one hears.

Mass Intentions: Intentions in the Diocese of Lincoln are suggested at \$10 each. They can be taken only up to a year in advance. Canon law states that a priest must say them within a year or delegate them to be said. Requests can be made for particular dates. However, it is to be stressed that there are no promises since others may have already taken the dates, or the priest may be on vacation, ill, or away. At present, there are no openings for Mass Intentions until October. Mass Intentions will be served on a first come, first served basis. At times, in an act of charity, one may be asked to allow other priests in the missions, retirement, or diocese to celebrate a Mass. This becomes a double act of charity, in that this may be the sole support some priests in the world receive, whose flocks cannot support them fully. By canon law, a priest may only keep the Mass stipend for one Mass per day (with the exception of Christmas). Stipends for any other Masses celebrated are sent to the Propagation of the Faith towards charitable works. Intentions should be sent to Fr. Rand directly.

<u>Day Off</u>: For the time being, Fr. Rand will be taking Thursdays as a "day off" until he has an opportunity to speak with the other North Platte priests on expectations and needs where we can serve our assignments by helping one another. Registration: Anyone new (or previously unregistered) to our parish is invited to register with us a member. Forms are located in the narthex and can be filled out and placed in the next week's collection or in the drop box by the narthex door to the offices.

Stewardship: Christian Stewardship refers to the responsibility that Christians have in managing God's many gifts He has bestowed. Christian stewards are wise caretakers of God's many gifts. We believe that a Christian, by virtue of Baptism, is a "follower of Christ", that is, a disciple of Christ. Discipleship involves much more than taking on the name of Christian or Catholic, though-it begins with an awareness of God's presence in your life and the recognition that Jesus is knocking on your door, inviting you into a relationship with Him. Then, it involves your choice, a conscious decision to accept that invitation and open the door – a conversion of mind and heart. What follows is the act of faith, the reorientation of your thoughts, words, and actions from self-centered and material motives - to a Christ-centered way of life. A Christian Steward recognizes that God is the origin of life and the source of all they have, gratefully receives and cultivates these gifts, and shares them in justice and love with others. Stewardship is a way of life, a life of accountability and responsibility acknowledging God as Creator and Giver of all. Stewardship involves responsible management of our God-given resources of time, talent, and treasure. Stewards as disciples of Jesus Christ see themselves as caretakers of all God's gifts. Gratitude for these gifts is expressed in prayer, worship, offering and action by eagerly sharing our gifts out of love for God and one another. Stewardship is a path to holiness. It makes us more like Christ who came not to be served, but to serve. It is a grateful awareness that all we have and all we are comes freely from God. When we offer our lives back to God in love, He blesses that generosity a hundredfold. Stewardship is an Act of Faith. Stewardship is based on the spiritual principles of the Old Testament and the teachings of Jesus. Stewardship is not just a program, or a method of fundraising, it is a way of thanking God for all His blessings by returning a portion of the time, talent, and treasure we have each received.
