Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of Anointing will be available at the end of Mass on Friday, August 12. It is available to: any Catholic in a state of grace over the age of 65, a Catholic of any age with a serious surgery in coming weeks or someone diagnosed with a life-threatening illness/disease (if unsure please ask Fr. Rand). At the conclusion of Mass, all wishing to receive the sacrament should form a line (like a Communion line) and proceed forward for the laying of hands and anointing of oil. They are asked to remain in their pews until the concluding prayer and blessing. In these changed times of COVID and other serious threats to health and life, it is hoped that this blessing may impart its peace.

Father's Helpers: Anyone who is willing to volunteer with time, talent, needs, and errands of the parish, along with mini-projects that may arise, can submit their names to a pool of potential helpers of first contact. How does a priest know which Mass to celebrate on a particular day? When the Mass is not prescribed such as a Sunday, Holy Day or something similar, a priest can choose from several options. Some may be for a particular saint, votive, or ritual. A hint can many times be found in understanding the meaning of the colors presented by chalice veils on the altar. For instance, red indicates typically a martyr or a connection to the Holy Spirit, green indicates ordinary time or white a non-martyred saint, the Blessed Mother, a votive and so forth. Companies that print Mass readings such as the Magnificat or Word Among us do not always present all the options available to a priest, and so sometimes the antiphons, responsorial, or readings may not correspond to what one hears.
