Many of us are familiar with the 80/20 rule. Twenty percent of parishioners typically do 80 percent of the work. Things to consider in increasing engagement. 1. Ask! It sounds simple, but the best way to get new individuals involved is to ask them personally. General invitations fall flat. Most people hearing it believe it does not apply to them or that someone else will step up to the plate. We need you! Expressed in terms of why a person was approached because of their strengths, skills or abilities resonates many times with their desire to be helpful and part of the team and success. 2. Keep it simple. When we are trying to get people to volunteer, especially for the first time, the simpler the request, the better. The easier we make that first step, the more likely it is that someone will take it. 3. Trust. Most leaders have a certain way they like to see things done. While it's important for things to be done correctly, doing something correctly is not always the same thing as doing it in precisely the same manner as it was done previously. It's important to trust that a new person will do something correctly, even if it is not done exactly the way it has always been done. If word goes around that someone will be looking over their shoulder or trying to micromanage their work, people will stop volunteering. Leaders need to learn to trust new people to do things in their own way, while still holding them accountable for the end result. 4. Celebrate. It is important to set aside time to say a word of thanks, offer praise or give a compliment. --summarized from Doug Powe's Leading Ideas.
